The Temptation of Jesus:

Luke 4:1-30 ESV

1. And Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, **returned from the Jordan** (#1 Identity Confirmed, Luke 3:21-22) and was led by the Spirit in the wilderness
2. for forty days, being tempted by the devil. And he ate nothing during those days. And when they were ended, he was hungry.
3. The devil said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command this stone to become bread."
4. And Jesus answered him, "**It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone.'**" (#2 Spiritual Bread VS Natural Bread)
5. And the devil took him up and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time,
6. and said to him, "To you I will give all this authority and their glory, for it has been delivered to me, and I give it to whom I will. (#3 Establish were and whos' Authority you are operation under)
7. If you, then, will worship me, it will all be yours." (get what you worship)
8. And Jesus answered him, "**It is written, 'You shall worship the Lord your God, and him only shall you serve.'**" (#4 Establish your loyalty to who's kingdom your going to serve)
9. And he took him to Jerusalem and set him on the pinnacle of the temple and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down from here,
10. **for it is written, (#5, overcome scriptural deception by true worship and faithfulness)** "He will command his angels concerning you, to guard you,"
11. and "On their hands they will bear you up, lest you strike your foot against a stone."

12. And Jesus answered him, “It is said, ‘You shall not put the Lord your God to the test.’” (**You will not test God when you trust Him**)
13. And when the devil had ended every temptation, he departed from him **until an opportune time. (He will wait and test your pride and fears!)**

Jesus Begins His Ministry.

14. And Jesus returned in the **power of the Spirit** (proper bread)to Galilee, and a report about him went out through all the surrounding country.
15. And he taught in their synagogues, **being glorified by all.(#6, beware of the pride of success)**

Jesus Rejected at Nazareth!

16. And he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up. And as was his custom, he went to the synagogue on the Sabbath day, and he stood up to read.
17. And the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. **He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written,(#7, be willing disobey the rules.)**
18. “The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed,
19. to proclaim the year of the Lord’s favor.
20. And he rolled up the scroll and gave it back to the attendant and sat down. And the eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him.
21. And he began to say to them, “**Today this Scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing.” (#8, be willing to speak prophetic truth that has no current information)**
22. And all spoke well of him and marveled at the gracious words that were coming from his mouth. And they said, “Is not this Joseph’s son?”
23. And he said to them, “**Doubtless** you will quote to me this proverb, (**#8, be Prophetic**) “Physician, heal yourself.” What we have heard you did at Capernaum, do here in your hometown as well.”
24. And he said, “Truly, I say to you, no prophet is acceptable in his hometown. (#9 , **over come rejection**) John 4:44
25. But in truth, I tell you, there were many widows in Israel in the days of Elijah, when the heavens were shut up three years and six months, and a great famine came over all the land,
26. and Elijah was sent to none of them but only to Zarephath, in the land of Sidon, to a woman who was a widow.
27. And there were many lepers in Israel in the time of the prophet Elisha, and none of them was cleansed, but only Naaman the Syrian.”
28. When they heard these things, all in the synagogue were filled with wrath. (**#10, be willing to confront**)

29. And they rose up and drove him out of the town and brought him to the brow of the hill on which their town was built, so that they could throw him down the cliff.
30. But passing through their midst, he went away. (**#11, learn the difference between winning a battle and winning the war.)**
