Discussion Questions:

1. What is the best (most cherished/expensive/sentimental – you can choose how to quantify “best”) thing someone had bought for you?
2. When were you first introduced to the idea that Jesus’s death paid for your sin? How was it explained to or illustrated for you?
3. Read 1 Corinthians 15:1–7. What stands out to you? Using that passage as a guide, if someone asked you to present the gospel message in one sentence, what would you say?
4. In your experience, why would someone be hesitant to believe and receive the message of the gospel?
5. Have you ever struggled with the notion that your personal sin required someone to die? Could sin be paid for in some other way?
6. Respond to this statement: Our eyes have adjusted to the darkness.
