## INTRODUCTION

The four Gospel writers (Matthew, Mark, Luke and John) give a testimony of the life and ministry of Jesus with their own particular perspective. Luke combines eyewitness testimonies with other sources to create an orderly account of Jesus' ministry. He shows Jesus as the Son of Man, the exalted One who is both fully man and fully God.

1. What is the most disgusting or bitter thing you have ever drank?
2. Jesus was fully God and fully human. Is it hard to think of Him in one or both of those ways? If so, why?
3. Dave mentioned the "I wonder..." game he played with his Wednesday night class. What do you "wonder" about Jesus as a human?
4. Do you find comfort in knowing that Jesus can sympathize with everything you are going through and experiencing? Why, or why not?
5. Can you remember the first time God found you? What do you remember about that moment?
6. Dave used the illustration of Jesus drinking a cup full of sin, shame and wrath so we could drink a cup of freedom. How does that effect the way you think about communion?
