KEY TRUTHS

- Courage isn't a personality. It's a skill built on top of something you already believe.
- Boldness in Scripture is measured in words, not adrenaline — the Spirit's evidence was a sentence.
- Timidity isn't a trait you were issued. It's a spirit you were never given.
- The cure for fear was never a better self-image — it's a bigger sense of who's standing behind you.

LEADERSHIP REALITIES

- You are in the business of giving other people's conviction a voice.
- Every hard true thing you say in public hands permission to someone who's been swallowing it.
- Your courage is contagious — but only the audible kind.

PRESENT-TENSE CHALLENGES

- You don't have a courage problem. You have a rehearsal problem.
- The wicked flee though no one pursues — what awkwardness have you been calling discretion?
- Stop praying “God, make this easier.” Start praying “God, give me the sentence.”

ACTION STEPS

- Write one sentence you believe and have never said out loud.
- Read it to the mirror until it stops shaking.
- Say it to one live human being before midnight. One rep today; fluency by month's end.
