Faith Group Questions
& Discussion Guide



Opening Prayer: Open just by worshipping God for Who He is.

Icebreaker: What is a name that has special meaning to you?

Key Points

1. God's majesty is personal, rooted in His unique character and authoritative name rather than a distant, abstract concept.
2. True spiritual strength and authentic worship are found in maintaining a humble, unjaded, and childlike dependency on God.
3. The immense scale and flawless precision of the universe serve as a daily, undeniable testimony to the Creator's power and intent.
4. Our ultimate value is not determined by our smallness in the cosmos, but by the magnificent love of a Savior who stepped into creation to redeem us.

Discussion Questions

1. Did you audit your advisors, change your internal playlist, or sink your roots deeper last week? Tell us about it!
2. When you hear the word "majestic," what images you've seen or personal experiences come to mind, and how do they fall short of God's grandeur? (Psalm 145:3, Isaiah 40:28, Ezekiel 1:26-28)
3. The sermon mentioned that the Jewish people hold God's proper name (*Yahweh*) in such reverence that they avoid speaking it. How can we cultivate that same level of deep respect for God's name in our modern, casual culture? Come up with some practical ways. (Psalm 119:55, Psalm 145:2)
4. Which name of God mentioned in the sermon—*El Shaddai* (Almighty/Nurturing), *El Elyon* (Most High), or *El Roi* (The God Who Sees)—resonates with your current life circumstances the most, and why? (Genesis 17:1, Psalm 57:2, Genesis 16:13)

5. Jesus used a child to show the disciples what "great faith" looks like. What are the specific traits of a child's faith that we lose as we become self-reliant adults? (Matt 18:1-4)

6. When you look at the staggering statistics of creation (like 200 sextillion stars), does it ever make you feel insignificant, or does it comfort you? How does the Gospel reshape that feeling? (Psalm 139, John 3:16)

7. David asks, "*What is man that You are mindful of him?*" In what moments of your life have you been most acutely aware that the Creator of the universe was actively mindful of *you*? (Psalm 116:1-9, 1 Corinthians 12:11, 24b)

8. How does shifting our focus from the vastness of the stars to the humility of the cross change the way we view our daily anxieties and struggles? (Romans 5:8, 1 Peter 5:6-7)

(Deep dive: Research and discuss some facts of the universe. Knowing that the galaxies display the "fingerprints" of God, how does this affect your knowledge of God's fingerprints on you? How does it affect your mindset to know that He meticulously fine-tuned the entire cosmic budget *just* so we could exist here to experience His love?)

Practical Applications

1. **Audit and Elevate Your Speech:** Commit to notice how often you or those around you use God's name casually or flippantly. Intentionally replace reactionary phrases with expressions of genuine gratitude, reserving His name strictly for prayer, praise, and purposeful conversation.

2. **Practice Names of God:** This week, whenever you feel overwhelmed, lonely, or unnoticed, pause for two minutes, look away from your screens, and explicitly pray a name of God. Find a verse with that name that you can pray at those times. (Check out this site: <https://www.gotquestions.org/names-of-God.html>)

3. **Engage in Creation Worship:** Spend at least one evening or early morning this week stepping outside specifically to observe the sky, stars, or nature. Use that intentional time to do what David did—meditate on the scale of God's work and verbally ascribe praise to Him as the source of it all.

Closing Prayer: Great God above all, whose glory fills the earth and heavens, magnify Your name in our world. Help us to bring our anxieties to You with childlike faith, and to live in such a way that we bring glory and honor to Your name.
