Faith Group Questions
& Discussion Guide



Opening Prayer: Open with praise to God for His everlasting, immovable Presence.

Icebreaker: Share an example of how people point to something and say, "I DID THAT."

Key Points

1. God's power is absolute and immovable: Unlike earthly leaders or personal strengths that falter, God possesses true majesty and has established a kingdom that can never be shaken.
2. The Lord's reign is eternal and unwearied: God existed before time began and will exist long after, ruling constantly without ever growing faint or tired.
3. God is mightier than the chaotic currents of life: Though the cultural and personal "floods" roar loudly around us, they are completely under the authority of the Sovereign King.
4. An unshakeable life is built on the foundation of God's Word: Because God's decrees are entirely trustworthy and holy, we find true security only when we align our minds and daily actions with His truth.

Discussion Questions

1. Did you fast from defending yourself, invite a blind spot check, or release a debt to the Cross? Tell us about it!
2. The sermon mentioned that "many people dress with the emblems of majesty, but they only look the part." In our modern world, what are some of the false "emblems of majesty" or power that people lean on instead of God? (Ps 20:7, Isaiah 31:1,3)
3. Looking back at Psalm 93:3, the Psalmist talks about the floods lifting up their voices. What do the "roaring floods or waves" look like in your life or in our culture right now? (Isaiah 5:20-23, Romans 13:13, 1 Peter 4:1-4)
4. How does knowing that God is from everlasting to everlasting (Ps 93:2) bring you comfort when your personal plans fail or the world feels chaotic? (Isaiah 45:15-19)

5. Can you share a time when you felt blindsided or sucked under by a "wave" of life, and how did you experience God being mightier than that storm? (Psalm 69:1-17)
6. The sermon noted that prosperity can cause spiritual amnesia, making us think we achieved success on our own. How can we actively protect our hearts, marriages, or families from this trap? (Deuteronomy 8:11-18, Joshua 4:5-7. As a fun alternative, listen to this song: https://youtu.be/75x5ENDubO0?si=jfkIW6_AAYaLO4dN - "Stacking Stones")
7. What is the practical difference between simply being a "hearer" of God's Word on Sunday and being a "doer" of it throughout the week? (James 2:14-17, 1 John 3:18)
8. Jesus stated in John 15:5 that apart from Him, we can do nothing. Why is it so difficult for us to live out that reality on a daily basis, and how can we get better at surrendering control to Him? (1 Thess 5:14-22)

Practical Applications

1. **Build a Daily Scripture Habit:** Commit to spending at least 10–15 minutes every morning reading and reflecting on God's Word before engaging with the news or social media, ensuring your mind is anchored in His trustworthy decrees first.
2. **Identify and Surrender a "Wave":** Write down the number one worry, cultural pressure, or overwhelming circumstance you are currently facing. Pray over it with an accountability partner, and consciously hand it over to the King who is mightier than the storm. Check up on your partner's "release" of their wave.
3. **Audit Your Successes:** Take time this week to look at areas where you are currently experiencing prosperity or comfort (e.g., career, family, health). Intentionally pray a prayer of thanksgiving, explicitly acknowledging God's sovereignty and role in those blessings to combat spiritual amnesia.
4. **Stack Stones:** Build a reminder of how God prepared, provided, or protected you – something you can put up at your home or office. Explain it to your children or friends.

Closing Prayer: Blessed are You, Lord God, King of the Universe, for You exist for all time, You are unshakeable, and You rule over all. Help us to trust You, both in the good times and the struggles. In Jesus' Name.
