Key Line

We will not be at our best if we are not present in our lives.

Introduction

Give an example of a time when you were tired and ready to relax but someone needed something from you.

- How did you feel when that need came up?
- How did you respond?
- How do you feel about the way you reacted to that need?

Seek the Word

Read John 4:4-26.

- Who was the woman in the story? (A Samaritan woman who was also living in a sinful relationship with a man she wasn't married to) What is it unusual that Jesus took time to speak with her? (She was a woman. As a man, he should not have spoken to a strange woman. She was also a Samaritan, and Jews did not speak with or associate with Samaritans. They considered them unclean people and avoided them at all costs.)
- How did Jesus treat the woman? (He treated her with respect and kindness without discriminating against her because of her gender or ethnicity.)
- How might Jesus have reacted to that woman instead of talking with her and reaching out to her in love? (He might have ignored her.) Why is it important that he did this? (He demonstrated that people are important and interruptions give us a chance to minister to those in need.)
- Give some more examples of Jesus taking time to be in the moment and taking advantage of chances to reach out with love. (Possible examples: healing the leper, standing up for the woman caught in adultery, healing the woman with bleeding)
- Why do you think Jesus stopped the teaching or ministry he was doing in order to deal with the situations at hand?

Read Ephesians 5:15-16.

- What does this verse mean when it says to make the most of every opportunity? (Don't waste your chances to be present in your life and to reach out to others.)
- What is one interpretation of "the days are evil"? (There is a lot to distract you from focusing on God every day.)
- What is our primary purpose as Christians? (To live and love like Jesus)

Talk About It

As believers, we have the opportunity to be present with one another, caring about one another.

- Share a time when Jesus was present with you when you really needed him. If you don't remember a time, think of a time when he sent someone to reach out to you when you really needed someone.
- How can we be present in each other's lives this week? Choose one way you will be present in your life or in someone else's life this week.
