Key Line

God has given us the responsibility of letting teenagers know how much they matter.

Introduction

The teenage years can be difficult and confusing, but they are also a time of growth. Teens are not just bodies, despite the fact that teenagers' bodies are changing a lot. They are also spiritual and can experience huge spiritual growth during their teenage years.

- Who were some important influences on you as a teenager?
- Who invested in you spiritually when you were a teenager?

Seek the Word

God sent Elijah to Elisha. They had a close mentoring relationship over the next few years. Read 2 Kings 2:2-10.

- When Elijah told Elisha to stay behind and leave his mentor, how did Elisha respond?
 (He refused. He said he would stay with his mentor.) What does this tell you about their relationship and how Elisha felt about Elijah? (They were close, and he loved him and determined to stay with him.)
- In verse 7, they stopped at the Jordan River. What later would happen at the Jordan? (Jesus was baptized there.) What did Elisha do there? (He slapped the water and parted it so they could cross over.) What does this remind you of? (It refers back to the Israelites crossing the Red Sea.) Why do you think God did this miracle right then? (It reminded Elijah and Elisha of their past and where they'd come from. It was a reminder of who they were.)
- In verse 9, Elisha asked for a double portion of Elijah's spirit. This was his inheritance since Elijah was like a father to him and since he had left his parents to follow Elijah. What is the significance of him asking for his spirit instead of anything else? (Elisha wanted to make a difference and was asking for what he knew would make a difference in the world. It also showed his love and appreciation for his mentor.)
- When we interact with teenagers and young people in the church, what are we teaching them? (How to follow Christ; how to carry the gospel forward to the next generation; how to live a godly life.)

In our church, the student ministry focuses on junior high and high school. We are dedicated to showing students they matter to God.

• Have you seen any teenagers in our church? What are ways you've seen them serving?

Talk About It

The disciples of Jesus were between the ages of 13 and 30.

- They were mostly teenagers. Why do you think Jesus chose teenagers and entrust them with the Gospel?
- What are some ways you can begin encouraging and mentoring younger people, especially teenagers? If you can't volunteer with the student ministry, how can you support it in different ways?
- Scott challenged us to choose several teenagers and begin praying for them every day. Who did you choose?
