"Do not be afraid. I am bringing you good news of great joy."


Let us go to Bethlehem to see this thing that has taken place.

May the Incarnate One be a lamp to our feet and a light to our path;


For you are merciful, and you love your whole creation,

### December 17





# we pray you help us respond with glad tidings of comfort and joy.


silence
