SACRAMENT OF HOLY BAPTISM FOR ETHAN JOSEPH, COLLIN ANDREW, LILLIAN ELISABETH AND LUCAS WILLIAM RING

The candidates for baptism, sponsors, and parents gather with the ministers at the font.

God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. By water and the Word God delivers us from sin and death and raises us to new life in Jesus Christ. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and joined in God's mission for the life of the world.

Sponsors present the candidate:

We present Ethan Joseph, Collin Andrew, Lillian Elisabeth and Lucas William for baptism.

The presiding minister addresses the parents:

Called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have Ethan, Collin, Lillian and Lucas baptized into Christ?

We do.

Ethan, Collin, Lilian and Lucas: called by the Holy Spirit, trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to be baptized into Christ?

We do.

The presiding minister continues:

Ethan, Collin, Lillian and Lucas, as you come to receive this gift—and parents, sponsors, as you accompany them—you are entering into the covenant life of baptism:

to live among God's faithful people,

to hear the Word of God and share in the Lord's supper,

to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word, and deed,

to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,

and strive for justice and peace in all the earth.

Ethan, Collin, Lillian, and Lucas, will you continue in this covenant God is making with you in baptism?

We will, and we ask God to help and guide us.

Parents, do you promise to help Ethan, Collin, Lillian, and Lucas continue to grow in the Christian faith and life?

We do.

Sponsors, do you promise to continue to accompany Ethan, Collin, Lillian, and Lucas in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help them live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

We do.

The assembly stands.

People of God, do you promise to support Ethan, Collin, Lillian, and Lucas and pray for them in his new life in Christ? Will you grow with them, learn with them, serve with them, and together give praise to God?

We will.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God? I renounce them.

Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God? **I renounce them.**

Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God? I renounce them.

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty,
creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead.*

On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic church,
the communion of saints,
the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting. Amen.

THANKSGIVING AT THE FONT

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

We give you thanks, O God, for in the beginning your Spirit moved over the waters and by your Word you created the world, calling forth life in which you took delight. Through the waters of the flood you delivered Noah and his family, and through the sea you led your people Israel from slavery into freedom. At the river your Son was baptized by John and anointed with the Holy Spirit. By the baptism of Jesus' death and resurrection you set us free from the power of sin and death and raise us up to live in you.

Pour out your Holy Spirit, the power of your living Word, that those who are washed in the waters of baptism may be given new life. To you be given honor and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and forever.

BAPTISM

The assembly is seated. The presiding minister baptizes the candidate. Ethan Joseph, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

Collin Andrew, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

Lillian Elisabeth, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

Lucas William, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

Let us pray. We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give your children new birth, cleanse them from sin, and raise them to eternal life.

Laying both hands on the heads of the newly baptized, the minister prays: Sustain (Ethan, Collin, Lillian, Lucas) with the gift of your Holy Spirit:

the spirit of wisdom and understanding,

the spirit of counsel and might,

the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord,

the spirit of joy in your presence, both now and forever.

Amen.

The presiding minister marks the sign of the cross on the forehead of the baptized. (Ethan, Collin, Lillian, Lucas), child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.

Amen.

WELCOME

A lighted candle may be given to the newly baptized.

Jesus said, I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will have the light of life.

Let us welcome the newly baptized.

We welcome you into the body of Christ and into the mission we share: join us in giving thanks and praise to God and bearing God's creative and redeeming word to all the world.

HOLY COMMUNION

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, that we should at all times in all places give thanks and praise to you, almighty and merciful God, through our Savior Jesus Christ. You made us in your image, for community you created us. When your Word became flesh, you made your home among us, bringing us all grace upon grace, for the sake of the world you so love. And so, with all the choirs of angels, with the church on earth and the hosts of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are ful of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Holy God, mighty and merciful, your people praise you, saying, Your mercy endures forever. Your mercy endures forever.

By your promise you bound yourself to earth and all its creatures, granting them life and calling them to flourish, setting the sign of your bow in the clouds, the colors of your love and faithfulness. Your mercy endures forever.

By your promise you joined us to Jesus, your Beloved, grafting us into your living Vine, and calling us to bear the fruit of your self-giving love.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying:
This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin.
Do this for the remembrance of me.

With this bread and cup we remember his life laid down and lifted up as we proclaim the mystery of faith. Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Send your Holy Spirit upon us and these gifts of bread and wine. Bless us to be a blessing. Make us a sign of your faithfulness. Send us to tend and cherish the earth and to serve the world with mercy and love.

With Diana, Bill, Ethan, Collin, Lillan and Lucas and all the saints in light, with earth and all its creatures, with sun and moon and stars, we praise you, O God, through Christ Jesus, in your Spirit, now and forever.
