Wisdom

Cherishing and Discerning the Truth in Love

- 1. Read 1 John 2:15-17. We hear a strong command in this passage, "Do not love the world." The way of the world is marked by "the desires of the flesh and the desires of the eyes and the pride of life." In short, sinful self-gratification and self-glorification. While these may sound like very generic problems, they have personal and particular force in our own lives. In what ways, do the structures of our world tempt you toward pleasure seeking and boasting?
- 2. Read Romans 12:1-3. The way of the world is constantly beckoning us toward a rejection of Jesus' way. Paul tells us to not be "conformed" to the way of the world. He calls us to continue to present ourselves to God that by his Spirit our minds would be transformed. That our beliefs and desired would be ordered in love of God rather than love of the world. That we would seek our fulfillment and happiness in God. He tells us that it is this transformation of mind that will enable us to truly discern God's way. What is made clear in this passage

is that being on guard against the temptations of the world and embracing the way of the cross is a continual call. We must "test" and "discern" daily what is of the world and what is of God. It is easy to get dizzied and dazzled by the world. How can you more intentionally commit to this call to present yourself to God each day? What practices can you incorporate in your daily life to cultivate this discernment?

Compassion

Moving Toward the Poor, Marginalized, and Broken in Love

 There are many worldly structures around us bent toward evil. Often these structures go unnoticed by us because we benefit from them. For example, perhaps the truth is you are not as concerned about the materialism of our culture because it benefits you. However, often these structures harm others. What worldly structures are in fact harming others and what might it look like to empathize with and seek justice for the poor or marginalized?

Reconciliation

Repentance and Forgiveness for the Sake of Love

 When our lives are ordered around pleasure and recognition we end up viewing others as resources for gratification or competition. This can even happen in the church. However, when we embrace the way of the cross our relationships are ordered by love and service. In what ways have you felt used by others and viewed as a threat? What would it look like to move towards these people in forgiveness?
