Are not all these who are speaking Galileans?

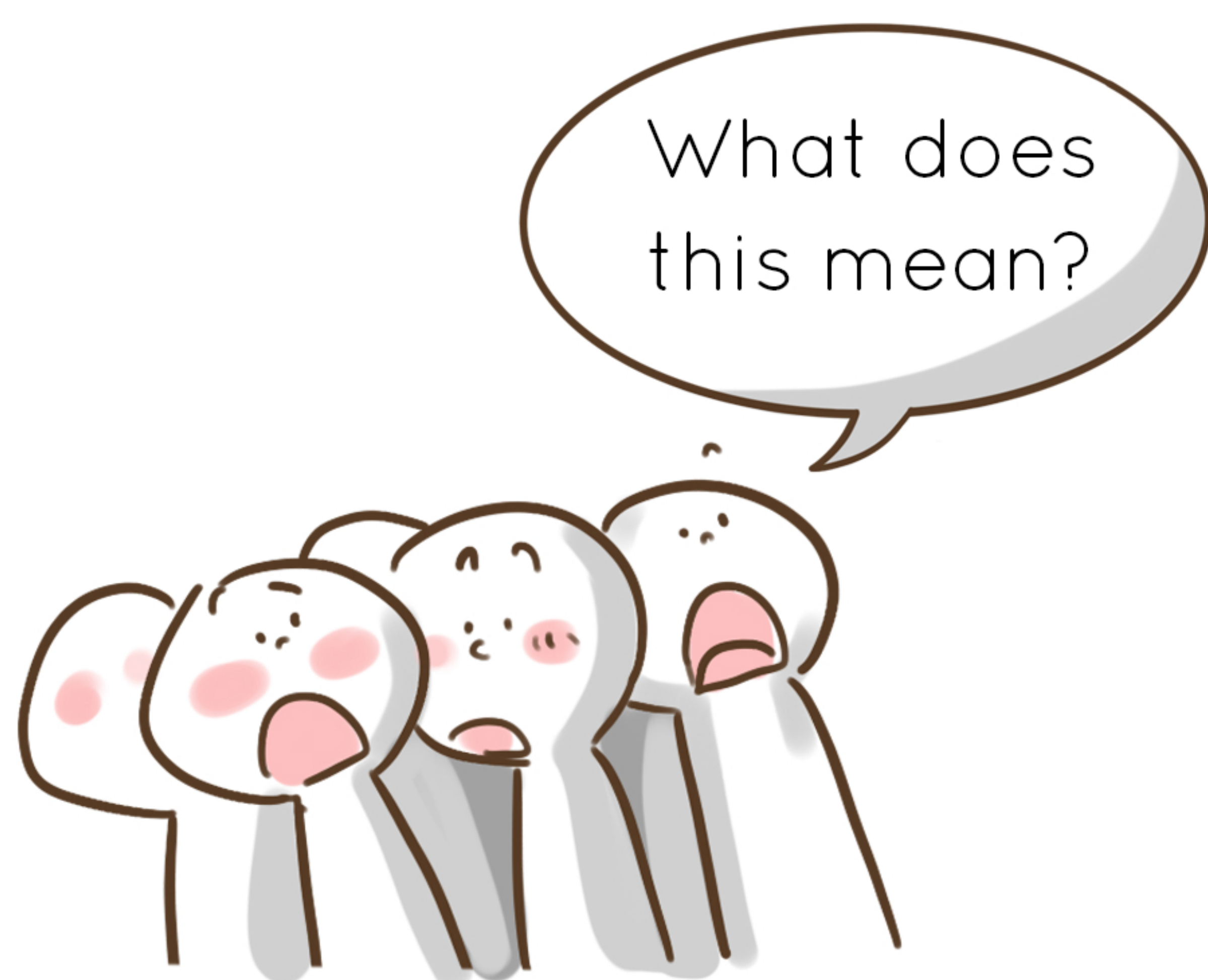


8 And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language?

DID YOU KNOW



Just before Pentecost, the apostles selected a replacement for Judas Iscariot by casting lots (Acts 1:26), which is similar to flipping a coin or rolling dice. This was how people learned God's will before the Spirit came and filled believers.



The Jewish feast of Pentecost is also called the Feast of Weeks and is described in Leviticus 23:15-22.



It is one of three feasts that Jews were required by the Law of Moses to celebrate (Deuteronomy 16:16). At the time of the apostles, Jews from all over the world had gathered in Jerusalem for the holy day.



The Holy Spirit came down and filled the believers on the morning of Pentecost. Peter mentioned the time as being around 9 a.m. (Acts 2:15).

You receive power from the Holy Spirit to be a witness for Jesus just like the apostles did!

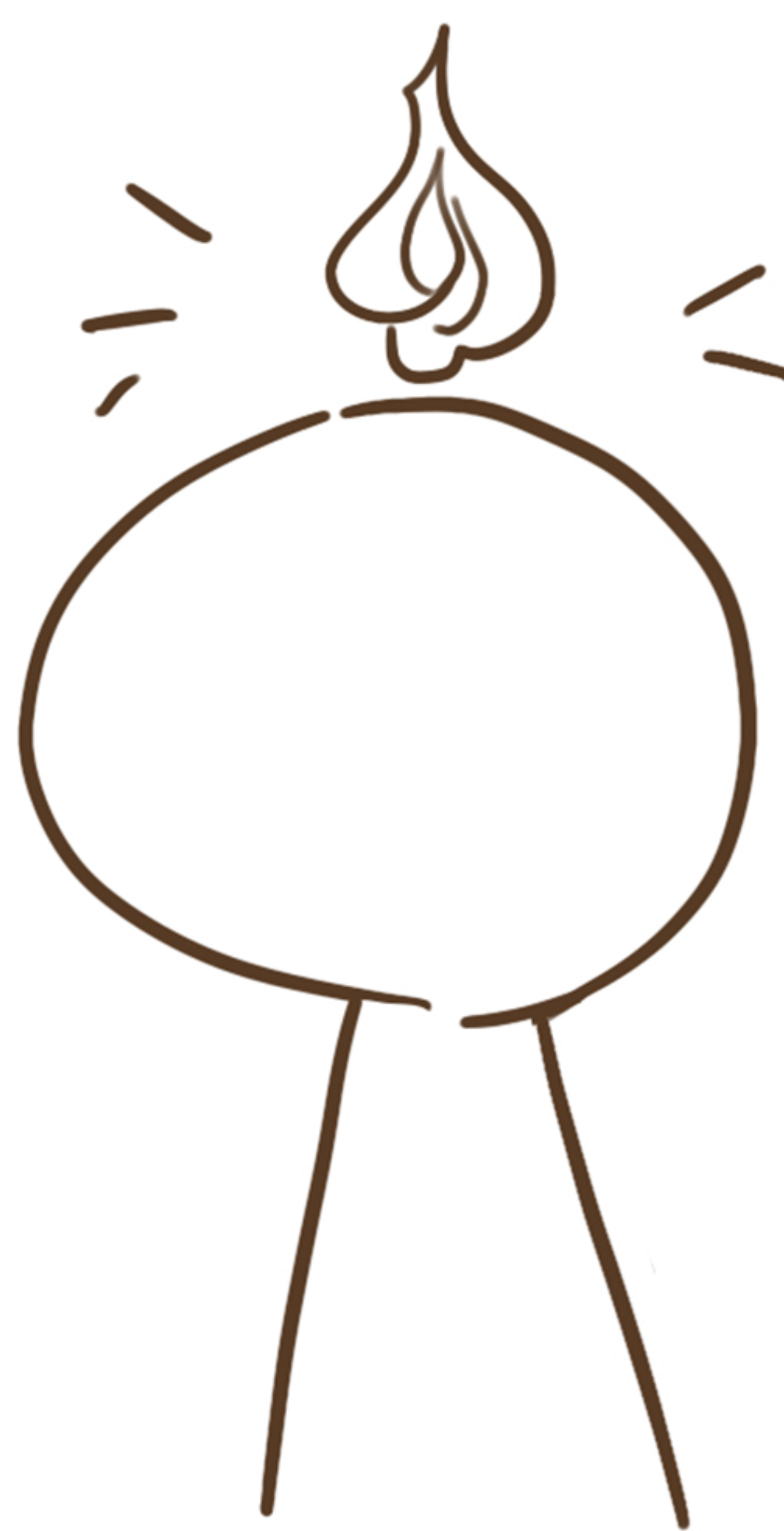
