
A Reflection on Reinhold Niebuhr


#### Reinhold Niebuhr

- Regarded as America's most influential theologian in the twentieth century
- Reinhold's writings and dynamic lectures made him a national figure from the 1930s to the 1970s
- Wrote the "Serenity Prayer"



#### Reinhold Niebuhr


- Best known as a theologian of "Christian realism"
  - The idea that because of human limitations and our sinful nature, we can never fully reach God's ethical standard, but we can come close.
  - He believed that humans could never reach
    Jesus' standard of love, but the best we could
    do was strive for justice, "which is love
    approximated."
- Niebuhr had full awareness that there was a racial problem in the US but he did not attempt to feel the pain of African Americans



""We can hardly blame Negroes for being impatient with the counsel for patience, in view of their age-long suffering under the white man's arrogance." Yet, Niebuhr continued in the same essay, "The fact that it is not very appealing to the victims of a current injustice does not make it any less the course of wisdom in overcoming historic injustices."

#### Billy Graham

- One of America's most revered preachers.
- His crusades allowed integration but did not believe in protesting nor fully supported the Civil Rights Movement
- In 2005 he expressed regret that he had not fought for civil rights more forcefully




#### Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.



"one day right there in Alabama little black boys and black girls will be able to join hands with little white boys and white girls as sisters and brothers."


#### Rev. Billy Graham
