Bottom Line: Comfortable faith works against God's plan for our lives.

The Story of Jonah

About a man with a comfortable plan for his life who is confronted by the real God, and he runs for his life.

Comfortable Christianity

1. Living for the approval of others, not God
2. Rarely sharing our faith in Christ
3. Instead of loving people, we're inconvenienced by them
4. We only turn to God when we need something
5. We only give when it's convenient

God Wants to Transform Us

God accepts you as you are, but he won't leave you there

Transformation isn't easy, but it leads to the best life possible
