Kingdom People: Exiles

Scriptures: Jeremiah 29:4-7; Matthew 22:15-22; Luke: 15:11-24 Bottom Line: Kingdom people remind the world of their true home

Exile - someone who has had to leave their home and can't go back

Home - A place of safety and refuge, where you are loved and accepted.

The Theme of Exile in the Bible

Israel were exiles and wanderers many times, eventually exiles in the place that was supposed to be their home

Humanity is also exiled from our home, even though we are living where our home is supposed to be

Jesus made a way for every person to reunite with their creator and come back home

The Way of the Exile

Jeremiah and Daniel show us what living like exiles doesn't mean withdrawing or assimilating, but working for the wellbeing of "Babylon" while keeping our true allegiance to God

Our New Role as Kingdom People

We are called to remind our world that we are all in exile: pointing them towards our King and our true home, and giving them a taste of their true home by welcoming them into a safe community.
