Scriptures: Luke 2:41-47; Luke 10:25-37; Mark 10:13-16

Bottom Line: Young people need to experience the good news of Jesus coming from supportive caring Christian adults

A teenaged Jesus was cared for, listened to, and valued by His community

Prioritize Everywhere

To prioritize the younger generation is to follow in the way of Jesus (Mark 10) and it breathes life into the whole church

Every child at WMBC has five adults in their life other than their parents to support

Be the Best Neighbours

To be the neighbour (Luke 10) is to go beyond our differences in ethnicity and socioeconomic status and care for the hurting and the overlooked.

We must empower and offer our young people a compelling picture of the Gospel — we fight for justice because it is grounded in who Jesus is and what life is about.

Next Steps

1. Parents: help your child identify mentors in their life
2. Do you have a young person in your life that you are investing in?
3. Who's in your 100? Do you have someone in your life with a different worldview or ethnicity?

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LISTENING

Have someone in your group answer one (or more) of these questions:

- What is one regret you have in your life?
- How have you experienced God's goodness in a tangible way?

After they share, tell them what you heard.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. Review Sunday's message. What stood out to you? What challenged you? Are there any lingering questions?
2. Did you ever get lost as a child? What happened?
3. Did you have adult mentors that invested in you as a young person?
4. What are you doing to prioritize young people in your life?
5. Where do you see adventure in your faith journey?
