Scriptures: Prov. 1:10-19; Gal. 6:7; 2 Cor. 9:6; Luke 6:38

Bottom Line: Someone harvests what you plant.

When is a Boundary Needed?

Opinions/Beliefs/Feelings = NO

Breaching Levels of Intimacy = YES

- When someone else is asking for access to you as though they were in a higher level of intimacy with you, a boundary is needed

Harvesting Someone Else's Negative Consequences = YES

- The Bible clues us into a rule of the world: you harvest what you plant. Sometimes we can "harvest" the negative consequences from someone else planting foolish decisions. When that happens, a boundary is needed.

3 Questions to Ask

1. Where am I feeling the consequences of someone else's actions?
2. Are others dealing with the consequences of my poor decisions?
3. Where am I experiencing an imbalance between my resources and the levels of intimacy in my relationships?
