INTRODUCTION

Does the Bible really say, “God lives in me”? What would change in our lives, if our thoughts, actions, and feelings were based on what the Bible says instead of what we think the Bible says?

GETTING STARTED

1. How often do you find ways to serve others? How do you serve those God put around you – at school, your neighborhood, at work, or in your own home?

FROM THE SERMON

2. Looking back at your notes from this week’s teaching, was there anything you heard for the first time that caught your attention, confused you, or challenged you?
3. God is all powerful. Read Psalm 33:4-9. Discuss the four ways the Lord showers us with His love (vs. 4-5). How is His power displayed? Together, consider the relationship between His love for us and the way He wields His power. How does this affect you?
4. God is all knowing. Read Psalm 33:13-15. Why do you think the Lord is concerned with observing us? How do you feel about knowing that the Lord sees everything you do?
5. God is present everywhere. Read Psalm 139:7-12. Is this just poetic language or a real factual statement about God’s existence? Why do you think it’s important to see God as Spirit?
6. Read Psalm 33:18-22. Define the fear of the Lord (vs. 18-19)? Being that God is all powerful, all knowing, and ever present, what three ways can we confidently trust in the Lord (vs. 20-22)?
7. What are you hearing from the Holy Spirit right now?

NEXT STEPS

8. What will you do with this new truth or spiritual insight as revealed by the Holy Spirit?
