- 4. Read James 3:9-12; 4:11-12. Why are the words we use such a dangerous form of vengeance? Share about a time when someone slandered you or cursed your name. Who else was affected? Did you retaliate? How long did it take for you to heal and forgive?
- 5. Read Romans 12:14-21. List and discuss the different ways Paul instructs us away from carrying out vengeance. What do you think Paul meant by saying that "we are placing burning coals on their heads" when we choose to love our enemies (vs. 20)?
- 6. What are you hearing from the Holy Spirit right now?
