INTRODUCTION

What do you want Me to do for you?

Can you imagine if Jesus looked you right in the eyes and asked that question? In the passage we're going to look at today, Jesus asked this question, not once, but twice. But as we'll see here in a moment, in one of the conversations, He was absolutely willing and able to answer the request. And in one of the situations He was not able, nor willing to answer their request. And it had everything to do with the proud heart vs the broken spirit.

Story #1—James and John (Mark 10:35-45)
