What Does it Mean that God is our Father?

It means Intimacy and Authority

He has CHOSEN and ADOPTED us (Ephesians 1:3-6)

He COMFORTS us (2 Corinthians 1:3-5)

He COUNSELS us (James 1:5)
He PROVIDES for us (2 Corinthians 9:6-8; Philippians 4:19)
He STRENGTHENS us (Ephesians 3:16; Colossians 1:11)
He CORRECTS and DISCIPLINES us (Hebrews 12:7-11)
He is GRACIOUS and UNDERSTANDING with us (Psalm 103:13-14)
He FORGIVES us when we fail (1 John 1:9)
He LOVES us more than we can possibly imagine (1 John 3:1; Ephesians 3:14-19)
