¹⁶All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, ¹⁷that the man of God [b] may be complete, equipped for every good work. 2 Timothy 3:16-17 (ESV)

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

1. **In Sunday's Sermon, Josh gave a practical step for intentionally assigning our time.** How much "screen time" have you recorded so far today? What would your day look like if you tithed (spent 10%) of that time praying and studying the Bible with your family tomorrow? How might that time look? (Ex. Reading outloud, journaling, etc.)
2. **Read 2 Timothy 3:16-17.** Which use of Scripture listed by Paul is more challenging for you: Teaching, Reproofing, Correcting or Training? Why?
3. **Read 2 Timothy 1:5-7. Think of someone who has impacted your faith in a powerful way.** What was it about that person that inspired you to follow God?

4. **Consider Paul's words to Timothy in verse 7 as it relates to sharing the message of Jesus.** Why do you suppose sharing our faith is scarier than sharing other views or beliefs we have? How does this verse impact your desire to share your faith?
5. **Read 2 Timothy 4:1-5.** What is one way you can share the gospel with someone described in verses 3-4?
6. **Read 2 Timothy 4:9-13.** What do you find interesting about this passage? Who are some people you enjoy discussing Scripture with or doing ministry with? Explain.
