 - Psalm 139:7-10
- C. Omnipotent = God’s power is limitless
 - Acts 10:38
 - Luke 1:35
- D. Omniscience = all-knowing
 - 1 Corinthians 2:10–11
- E. Imparts supernatural gifts
 - 1 Corinthians 12:1,4,11
- F. Authority
 - Matthew 12:28
- G. Chooses leadership
 - Acts 20:28
- H. Divine names and titles given to the Holy Spirit
 - Holy Ghost / Holy Spirit... used 97x’s
 - Spirit of God... The Spirit of the Lord... The Spirit of the Living God

- The Spirit of Christ... The Spirit of His Son... The Spirit of Jesus Christ
- The Spirit of Burning... The Spirit of Holiness... The Holy Spirit of Promise
- The Spirit of Truth... The Spirit of Life... The Spirit of Wisdom and Understanding
- The Spirit of Counsel and Power... The Spirit of Knowledge and Fear of the Lord
- The Spirit of Grace and Supplications... The Spirit of Glory and of God
- The Eternal Spirit... The Counselor/Helper/Comforter
- The Spirit of your Father... The Spirit of Prophecy

3. The _____ of the Holy Spirit

- A. Personal **pronouns** are used in reference to the Holy Spirit:
- John 15:26, 16:7
- B. Personal **attributes** are ascribed to Him:
- Mind... Romans 8:27
 - Knowledge... 1 Corinthians 2:10-11
 - Personal Will/Volition... 1 Corinthians 12:11, 14:1
 - Emotions... He can be:
 - i. Grieved... Isaiah 63:10, Ephesians 4:30
 - ii. Lied to... Acts 5:3
 - iii. Blasphemed... Matthew 12:31-32
 - The unpardonable sin today is the state of continued unbelief
 - The Spirit currently convicts the unsaved world of sin, righteousness, and judgment (John 16:8)
 - To resist that conviction and willfully remain unrepentant is to “blaspheme” the Spirit
 - iv. Insulted... Hebrews 10:9
 - v. Resisted... Acts 7:51
 - vi. Obeyed... Acts 10:19-20, 23
