Genesis 17:15–17 (NLT) — "Then God said to Abraham, 'Regarding Sarai, your wife—her name will no longer be Sarai. From now on her name will be Sarah. 16 And I will bless her and give you a son from her! Yes, I will bless her richly, and she will become the mother of many nations. Kings of nations will be among her descendants.' 17 Then Abraham bowed down to the ground, but he laughed to himself in disbelief. 'How could I become a father at the age of 100?' he thought. 'And how can Sarah have a baby when she is ninety years old?"

• Sarah = princess




Abraham and Sarah waited...



A hopeless situation is some circumstance in life which comes your way and no amount of human effort can change it...








hope

Hope's antithesis is **DESPAIR**.





Psalm 107:20 (NLT) — "He sent out his word and healed them, snatching them from the door of death."




