Receiving God's Forgiveness

Zechariah 3:3 (NLT) — "Jeshua's clothing was filthy as he stood there before the angel."

To Receive God's **Forgiveness You Must Understand How Desperate** Your Situation Is

Isaiah 64:6–7 (NLT) — "We are all infected and impure with sin. When we display our righteous deeds, they are nothing but filthy rags. Like autumn leaves, we wither and fall, and our sins sweep us away like the wind. 7 Yet no one calls on your name or pleads with you for mercy. Therefore, you have turned away from us and turned us over to our sins."

We Will Never Reach Out to God for Forgiveness Until We Realize How Awful Our Sin Is In His Sight

Psalm 51:1–5 (NLT) — "Have mercy on me, O God, because of your unfailing love. Because of your great compassion, blot out the stain of my sins. 2 Wash me clean from my guilt. Purify me from my sin. 3 For recognize my rebellion; it haunts me day and night. 4 Against you, and you alone, have I sinned; I have done what is evil in your sight. You will be proved right in what you say, and your judgment against me is just. 5 For I was born a sinner— yes, from the moment my mother conceived me."



Sin Has It's Consequences

Nahum 1:3 (NLT) — "The LORD is slow to get angry, but his power is great, and he never lets the guilty go unpunished. He displays his power in the whirlwind and the storm. The billowing clouds are the dust beneath his feet." **Galatians 6:7 (NLT)** — "Don't be misled—you cannot mock the justice of God. You will always harvest what you plant."

Christ, Our Substitute

2 Corinthians 5:21 (NLT) — "For God made Christ, who never sinned, to be the offering for our sin, so that we could be made right with God through Christ."

Isaiah 53:4–6 (NLT) — "Yet it was our weaknesses he carried; it was our sorrows that weighed him down. And we thought his troubles were a punishment from God, a punishment for his own sins! 5 But he was pierced for our rebellion, crushed for our sins. He was beaten so we could be whole.
