Isaiah 53

- "The Passion of the Christ" is based on Isaiah 53
- Seeing this level of violence gets us to ask, "If he suffered like that, if he died for me, then what sort of response should I make to him?"

Jesus' suffering before and his death on the cross are both vital to our theological understanding of how he brings us back to God

1. What was the result of Adam and Eve's

Ephesians 2:1-3

If Jesus was to overcome the effects of Adam and Eve's rebellion, he needed to enter into the suffering that we endure

Why is there so much human suffering?

- This isn't the way God intended the world to be
- We aren't the way God intended us to be
