It may mean an opportunity to preach the Gospel when he is to appear before the Imperial Court. Other sections of scripture talk about opening doors For example: |
| Rev 3:7-8 "And to the angel of the church in Philadelphia write: 'The words of the holy one, the true one, who has the key of David, who opens and no one will shut, who shuts and no one opens. (8) "I know your works. Behold, I have set before you an open door, which no one is able to shut. I know that you have but little power, and yet you have kept my word and have not denied my name. |

As one of the commentators says: "The same sun that softens the wax hardens the clay; and so the very same gospel message that humbles the honest heart and leads to repentance may also harden the heart of the dishonest listener and confirm that one in their path of disobedience. Thus the parables spoke to the crowds do not simply convey information, nor mask it, but challenge the hearers."
