## How is the Fear of the LORD the Beginning of Knowledge?

Fearing God is the "starting point" to knowledge; God is the One who has all knowledge and wisdom (Prov 2:6; James 1:5).

## Fools Despise - Proverbs 1:7b

The opposite of the fear of the Lord is the rejection of instruction and humility.

If the fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge, then those who despise wisdom and instruction are those who don't have a filial fear of God.
