Small Group Guide: God's Mercy to All

Opening Question:

What comes to mind when you think about the Jewish people and their relationship with God?

Key Takeaways:

- 1. God has not rejected the Jewish people; they remain part of His plan.
- 2. There is a remnant of Jewish believers, chosen by God's grace.
- 3. The temporary hardening of some Jewish hearts has allowed salvation to come to the Gentiles.
- 4. Gentile believers are grafted into God's family alongside Jewish believers.
- 5. God's gifts and calling for the Jewish people are irrevocable.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. How does Paul's statement that "God has not rejected His people" challenge common misconceptions about the Jewish people's place in God's plan?
- 2. Discuss the concept of the "remnant" mentioned in the message. How does this idea apply to both Jewish and Gentile believers?
- 3. The sermon mentions that it's difficult to define a single common thread among Jewish people. How might this insight affect our understanding of and interactions with Jewish individuals?
- 4. How does the metaphor of Gentiles being "grafted in" to the olive tree help us understand our relationship to God and to Jewish believers?

- 5. The message warns against arrogance in our faith. In what ways might believers today display arrogance in their spiritual lives?
- 6. How does understanding God's ongoing commitment to the Jewish people impact our view of His faithfulness to us?

Practical Applications:

- 1. Reflect on any preconceived notions you may have had about Jewish people or Judaism. How has this sermon challenged or changed those ideas?
- 2. Practice humility this week by consciously recognizing that your salvation is a gift of God's grace, not a reason for pride.
- 3. Research more about Jewish culture and traditions to better understand the context of your faith's roots.
- 4. If possible, reach out to a Jewish friend or acquaintance and engage in a respectful conversation about faith and heritage, lifecycle events, etc. Ask questions.
- 5. Spend time in prayer, thanking God for His faithfulness to His promises and for including people from all nations in His plan of salvation.

Closing Reflection:

Read Romans 11:33-36 together and discuss how these verses summarize the main points of the message. How do they encourage us to approach the mysteries of God's plan with humility and wonder?
