

Small Group Guide: The Final Countdown - Part 1
January 24, 2026 Parsha Bo (Exodus 10-12)

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. The message mentioned evil "festering" in various parts of the world. How should believers respond to global evil and suffering? Should we be indifferent, worried, or something else?
2. Read Matthew 28:18-20. What does it mean that "all authority" has been given to Yeshua, even while evil still operates in the world?
3. How can we be "a light to the nations" in practical ways this week? What does that look like in your workplace, neighborhood, or family?
4. Why is the Exodus story so central to understanding both the Old and New Testaments? What makes it more than just a historical event?
5. Read Exodus 11:7 and 7:5. What was God demonstrating to both Egypt AND Israel through the plagues? Why was it important for both groups to know who God is?
6. "Yeshua came for the lost sheep of Israel...it INCLUDES the nations BECAUSE Yeshua paid the redemption price for Israel." How does this perspective change or deepen your understanding of salvation?

7. The sermon mentioned several "divine reversals":

- Pharaoh used the Nile for genocide; God used Moses (saved from the Nile) to deliver Israel
- Yeshua's death seemed like defeat but brought redemption

Can you think of other divine reversals in Scripture?
