Opening Discussion:

- 1. What stood out to you most from the message? Why?
- 2. How do you typically view the concept of "good and evil"? Did the message help your perspective at all?

Key Takeaways:

- 1. Genesis assumes God's existence and doesn't attempt to prove it.
- 2. In ancient Near Eastern context, "good" often meant "ordered" or "complete," while "evil" (ra) implied "unraveling" of God's order.
- 3. Humans are created as caretakers of the Earth, in partnership with God.
- 4. The Bible consistently refers back to Creation to anchor important truths.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. How does viewing "evil" as an unraveling of God's order change your understanding of sin?
- 2. In what ways do you see humans acting as caretakers of the Earth today? Where are we failing in this role?
- 3. The message mentions that Biblical heroes were imperfect. How does this impact your view of faith and your own relationship with God?
- 4. Discuss the concept of humans being "conduits of God's love and kindness." What does this look like in practice?

Practical Applications:

- 1. This week, try to identify one way you can be a better "caretaker" of God's creation.
- 2. Reflect on areas in your life where you might be "unraveling" God's order. What steps can you take to align more closely with His design?
- 3. Choose one Biblical hero and research their story. How does their imperfection and God's use of them encourage you in your own faith journey?
