

Small Group Guide: "This is All That God Asks of You"

Discussion Questions

1. Balaam's Blessing (Numbers 24:3-9)

- Why couldn't Balaam curse Israel even though he was hired to do so?
- What does God's protection of Israel teach us about His faithfulness?
- How should understanding Genesis 12:3 affect how believers today view Israel and the Jewish people?

2. The Core Message (Micah 6:6-8)

- What were people asking about in verses 6-7? What religious activities were they considering?
- How does verse 8 redirect their focus? What is God actually looking for?
- Why do you think people tend to focus on religious rituals rather than relationship?

3. Image Bearers

- The message states: "Our conduct impacts our reputation... and God's reputation." When have you seen this play out positively or negatively?
- In what areas of your life do you struggle most to reflect God's image to others?

4. Love and Unity

- Yeshua said people would know we are His disciples by our love for one another (John 13:34-35). On a scale of 1-10, how well do you think the Body of Believers demonstrates this unity to the world?

5. Beyond Ritual to Relationship

- The message challenges us to move "from purely religion to a natural lifestyle of living a God-centered... Messiah-centered life." What's the difference?

- Are there any religious practices you do that have become routine rather than relational? How can you breathe new life into them?

6. Practicing Justice, Loving Mercy, Walking Humbly

- Justice : Who in your sphere of influence needs someone to stand up for them or advocate for fairness?

- Mercy : Who needs you to extend grace and compassion this week?

- Humility : In what situation do you need to walk more humbly with God?

7. Lifestyle vs. Checklist

- The message mentions that some people focus only on Shabbat, God's appointed times, and Biblical eating. While these are good, what's missing if that's all we focus on?

- How can we ensure our spiritual practices lead us to love God and others more deeply?

God isn't asking us to perform perfectly—He's inviting us into relationship. Let's respond to His love by loving Him and others well.
