Passage Summary

James encourages his readers to patiently endure with their oppressors until Jesus' return. He exhorts them to stand firm, not to grumble, but to remain true to each other, looking to the example of the prophets before them and keeping their word.

Action Steps

- 3. Speak charitably.
- 4. Follow tested examples.
- 5. Remember God's character.
- 6. Keep your word.

Scripture Meditation

James 5:7-8

Be patient, therefore, brothers, until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth, being patient about it, until it receives the early and the late rains. You also, be patient.

- 3. What effect can impatience have on one another? What is the connection that James is making between impatience and a grumbling heart?
- 4. What does the phrase in verse 8 "establish your hearts" mean, practically speaking?
- 5. What two characteristics about God does James mention in order to comfort and encourage the believer?
- 6. What is James encouraging the Christians of his day to emulate in in the life and character of the prophets and of Job? How are the prophets and Job examples of patient endurance?
- 7. What wrong attitudes or practices with regard to taking oaths is James confronting?
