Unitasker vs Multi-taker

- Something that does multiple things, usually doesn't do all those things well
- when something is created for one purpose it does it best

Genesis 22:1-14

- Abraham is given a test from God
 - Instruction was to sacrifice his son
 - Preparations - Isaac carried the wood
 - When it came time to sacrifice Isaac
 - The Angel of the Lord stopped Abraham
 - **This test demonstrated Abrahams willingness to hold nothing back from his worship and devotion to God**
- What Abraham said before came to pass, God provided the lamb/ram for sacrifice

Genesis 22:15-24

- God reiterates his promise to Abraham
 - The covenant God made for Abraham

Parallel of Isaac and Jesus

- Abraham given a promise that only depended on God for an inheritance
 - God gave creation a promise of salvation that depended only on him for their inheritance of heaven
- A test of his faithfulness Abraham was to sacrifice his only son
 - God demonstrated his love through the sacrifice of Jesus
- Isaac participated in the preparation of his sacrifice by carrying the wood
 - Jesus participated in the preparation by carrying The Cross
- The Angel of the Lord stopped Abraham from killing Isaac
 - An Angel sat in the tomb to announce dead was defeated and Christ had risen from the dead.

• **We are Uni-taskers**

- We are Designed, Created and Commissioned to serve one purpose
 - That is to worship God and be his representatives in Creation
 - We exist as his representatives by fulfilling that purpose it is worship to the God that we represent
 - When we live in our purpose everything else falls into place
 - We represent Christ as an outpouring of Worship
- In our purpose, God provides everything we need to achieve His Purpose
 - Without worship to God, we serve our own Purpose
