Joshua 5

As soon as all the kings of the Amorites who were beyond the Jordan to the west, and all the kings of the Canaanites who were by the sea, heard that the Lord had dried up the waters of the Jordan for the people of Israel until they had crossed over, their hearts melted and there was no longer any spirit in them because of the people of Israel.

Hearts Melt Before the Lord

Hearts that melt before the Lord in faith stay soft and pliable in repentance

Hearts that melt before the Lord in fear solidify again to even greater resistance

Faith in Holiness

1. Circumcision of the heart is the mark that identifies a covenant person

15

Deuteronomy 30:6

6 And the LORD your God will circumcise your heart and the heart of your offspring, so that you will love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul, that you may live.

16

Deuteronomy 10:15-16

15 Yet the LORD set his heart in love on your fathers and chose their offspring after them, you above all peoples, as you are this day. 16 Circumcise therefore the foreskin of your heart, and be no longer stubborn.

Romans 2:28-29

28 For a person is not a Jew who is one outwardly, and true circumcision is not something visible in the flesh. 29 On the contrary, a person is a Jew who is one inwardly, and circumcision is of the heart by the Spirit, not the letter. That man's praise is not from men but from God.

Pre-InCarnate Revelation of Jesus

We know that this Being, standing before Joshua, was God. Though the title Commander of the army of the LORD could perhaps apply to an angel (such as Michael, based on a passage like Revelation 12:7), Joshua's falling down, and worshipping is inconsistent with angels, who never receive worship (Revelation 22:8-9).

God is on my Side

It's rhetorically correct to say that "God is on my side" because God is certainly for us, but it is not theologically correct because we have joined the Lord's side, He did not join our side. Nor could he join our side (our plan or our goals) because to do so would mean relinquishing His own.

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
2 Timothy 2:11-13
