



Feast of Tabernacles

The festival of Sukkot uniquely symbolizes the Messianic Era; Simon Peter's offer to build sukkot for the Messiah and his Messianic-era guests seems especially appropriate to the holiday theme of inviting exalted guests into the Sukkah.

Zechariah 14

16 Then everyone who survives of all the nations that have come against Jerusalem shall go up year after year to worship the King, the Lord of hosts, and to keep the Feast of Booths. 17 And if any of the families of the earth do not go up to Jerusalem to worship the King, the Lord of hosts, there will be no rain on them.

Old Testament Imagery

Moses and Elijah, Peter James and John are not the only ones up on the mount of Transfiguration. God the Father himself is in their midst in an (at least at first) unnoticed bright cloud.

What was Peter Lacking?

- 1. Understanding about [suffering] Messiah
- 2. Revelation of the Deity of Christ
- 3. Fear (reverence) of the Lord

Presence of God Produces Holy Fear

The presence of God's voice in a cloud resembled the way God spoke to the Israelites in the wilderness in the Old Testament. Just as the Israelites responded in fear then, so Peter, James, and John bowed in fearful worship as they heard the voice of God telling them to listen to His Son.

2 Peter 1:16-18

16 For we did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of his majesty.

2 Peter 1:16-18

17 For when he received honor and glory from God the Father, and the voice was borne to him by the Majestic Glory, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased," 18 we ourselves heard this very voice borne from heaven, for we were with him on the holy mountain.

What is the glory of God?

Glory of God is the manifest beauty of his holiness. It is the going-public of his holiness. It is the way he puts his holiness on display for people to see and experience. The glory of God is the holiness of God made manifest.

Knowledge and Experience

Knowledge of God's Word grows our faith. Experience of the beauty of God's presence and goodness grows our love.
