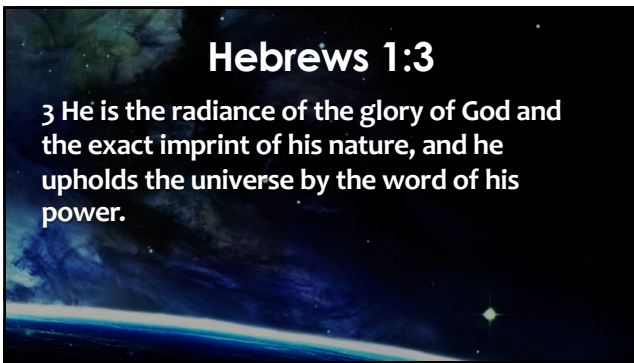
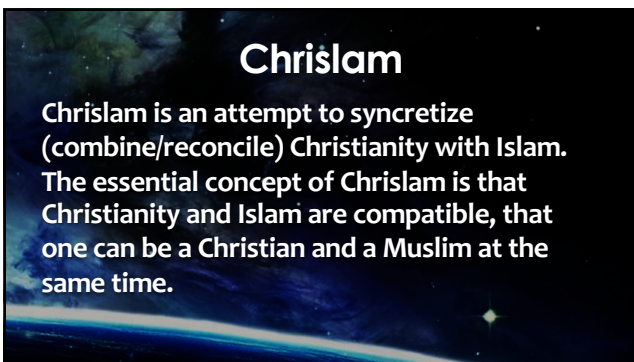

Qur'an: God sent many messengers

The Quran says that God sent "messengers to every people" (10:48) and "We raised among every people a messenger" (16:37). Prophet Muhammad further declared that God has sent no less than 124,000 prophets to mankind throughout history (Ibn Hanbal, Musnad, 5, 169) of which only 25 are mentioned directly in the Quran.

Islam is Ideal Religious Integrator

Islam as taught in the Quran is the ideal religious integration mechanism because of it's unspecified 124,000 messenger/ prophets from other religions. The main requirement for Islam is to believe in Allah and the prophet Mohammed.

Claim: The Religion of Abraham

In Islam, the Quran is believed to be a revelation from the last prophet in the Abrahamic succession, Muhammad, about obedience to God (Islam)... The Quran itself calls Islam the "religion of Abraham" (Ibrahim) and refers to Jacob (Yaqub) and the Twelve Tribes of Israel as being Muslims.

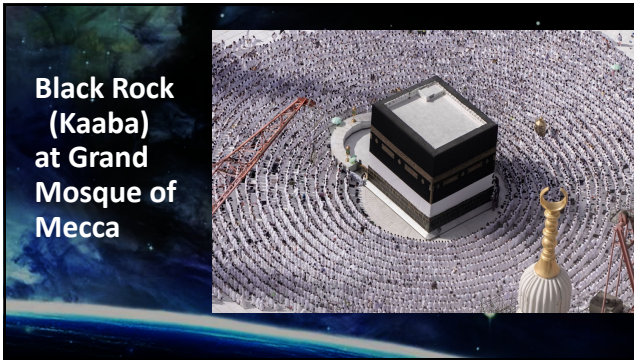

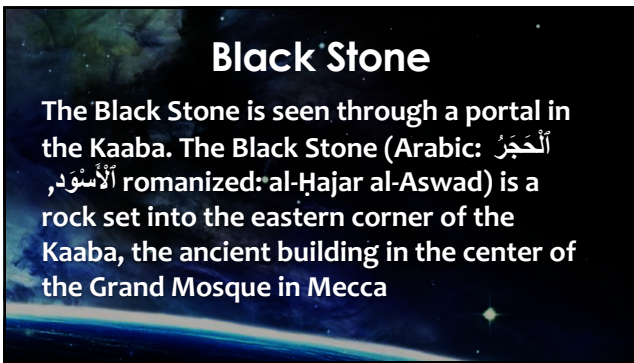

Mecca**

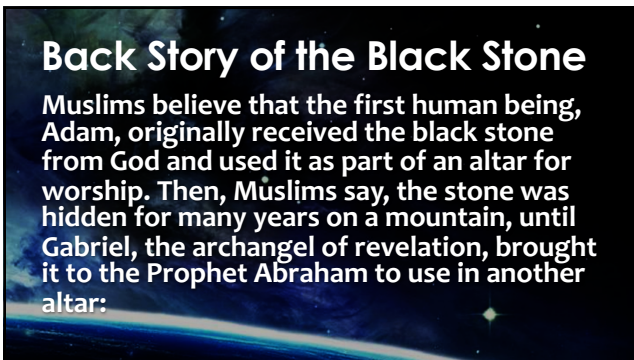

Black Stone

The Black Stone is seen through a portal in the Kaaba. The Black Stone (Arabic: **الْحَجَرُ الْأَسْوَدُ** romanized: **al-Hajar al-Aswad**) is a rock set into the eastern corner of the Kaaba, the ancient building in the center of the Grand Mosque in Mecca

Back Story of the Black Stone

Muslims believe that the first human being, Adam, originally received the black stone from God and used it as part of an altar for worship. Then, Muslims say, the stone was hidden for many years on a mountain, until Gabriel, the archangel of revelation, brought it to the Prophet Abraham to use in another altar:

Back Story of the Black Stone

... the altar where God tested Abraham's faith by calling him to sacrifice his son Ishmael (unlike Jews and Christians, who believe that Abraham laid his son Isaac on the altar, Muslims believe that it was Abraham's son Ishmael instead).

Messenger vs Prophet

Messenger is a prophet who is specifically chosen by Allah to deliver a new religious law or convey a specific message to a particular community or civilization.

Prophet is a chosen individual by Allah (God) to receive divine revelations and guidance.

Red Sea parting, destruction of Pharaoh

Allah Forgave the Jews
 Forgiving golden calf idol worship
 “And remember when We appointed forty nights for Moses, then you worshipped the calf in his absence, acting wrongfully.”

Difference Between Jews - Muslims
 The Jews said, “we hear and disobey” while Muslims say “we hear and obey”
 “And when We took your covenant and raised the mountain above you saying, “Hold firmly to that Scripture which We have given you and obey,” they answered, “We hear and disobey.” [Quran 2: 93]

Difference Between Jews - Muslims
 “Guide us along the Straight Path, the Path of those You have blessed—not those You are displeased with, or those who are astray [Jews].” [Quran 1: 6-7]

Qur'an: Two Types of Jews

The first type is corrupted, who insist on disobeying Allah and His Prophets

The second type of Jew is righteous who accept the truth as given by His prophets including Mohammed

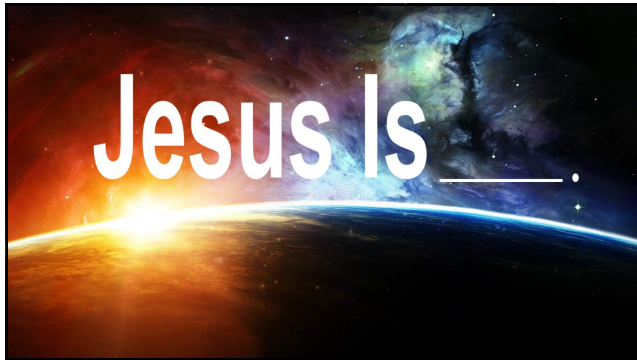
