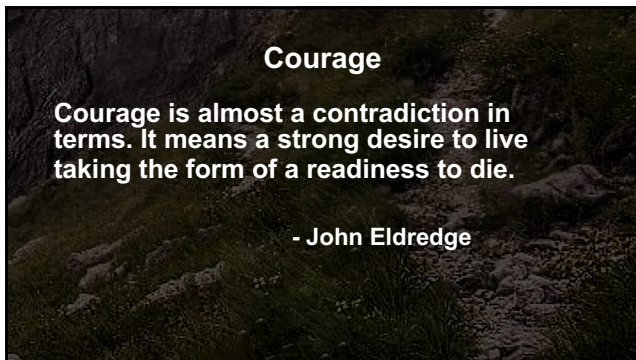
Dwell is Where We Reside
