Word translated "rule" is from the Greek word brabeuo, which in ancient times was used to describe the umpire or referee who moderated and judged the athletic competitions that were so popular in the ancient world.

Reveals and Heals Inner Vows

Thomas said with his words what many have made as vows to themselves in their mind. I will not believe in the supernatural power of God unless [this] happens. These types of inner vows are what makes up the spirit of our mind. It takes a spiritual encounter with Jesus to overcome these vows.

Thomas Refusal to Believe

- Stor

He didn't doubt but refused to believe Ignored testimony of many witnesses and reliable witnesses

Made extreme demand for evidence of sight, of repeated touch, of multiple wounds of Jesus

3. Jesus showed himself alive 8 times after his resurrection from the dead. His first appearance alive was to Mary Magdalene (Mark 16:9 - 11). He showed himself to two disciples traveling to Emmaus, then Peter (Luke 24). Next, he appeared to all the disciples except Thomas (John 20:19 - 24) then a week later to all them when Thomas was present (John 20:26 - 29) and 7 disciples John 21:1-2).
