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Normalcy Bias is the tendency to underestimate the likelihood or impact of a disaster or other crisis. This bias can lead people to make inadequate or inappropriate preparations for a crisis, or to underestimate the severity of a situation that we've not experienced before.

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Optimism Bias

An optimism bias may cause us to believe that we are less likely to experience hardships than other people are, and more likely to experience success.


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Confirmation Bias

Confirmation bias is the tendency to search for, interpret, focus on and remember information in a way that confirms one's preconceptions
