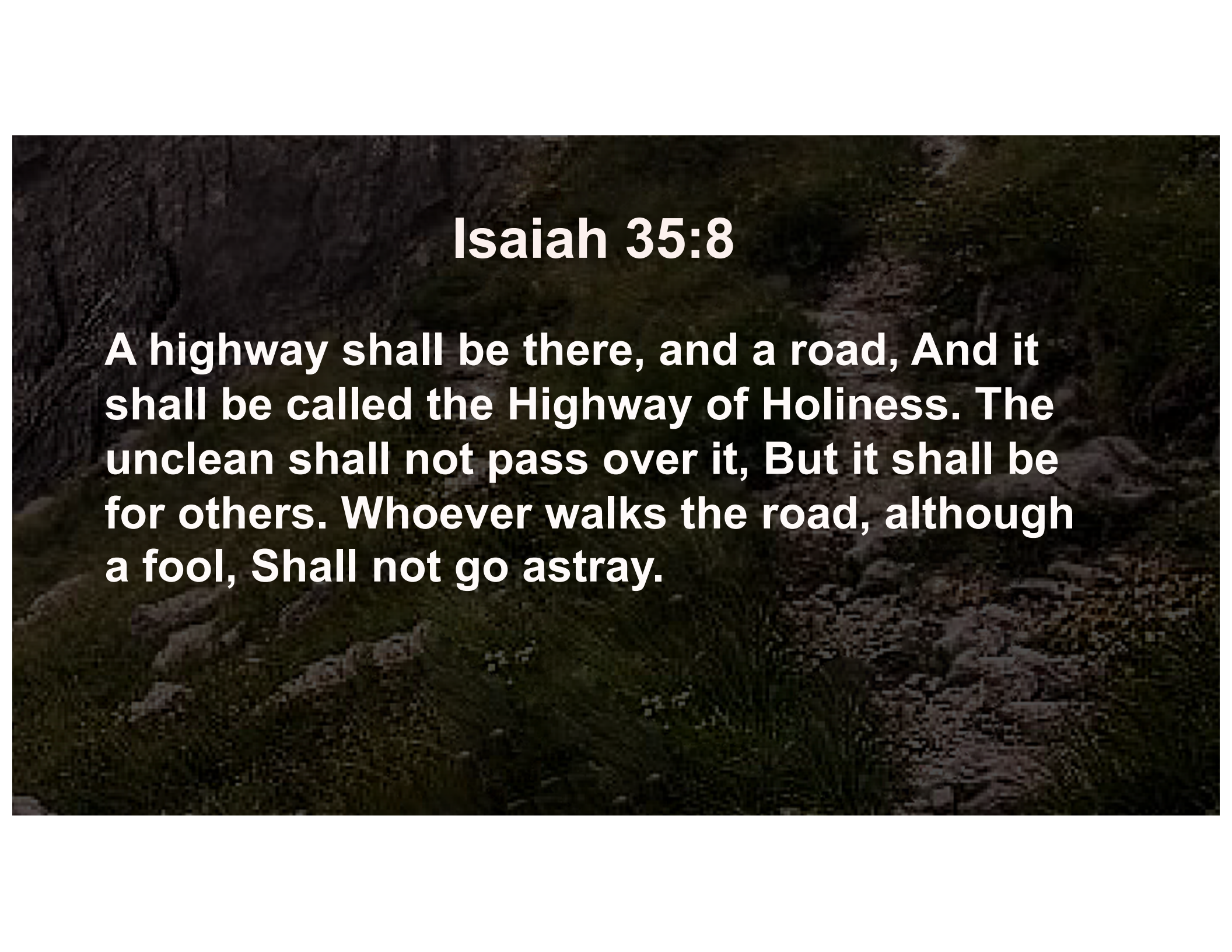


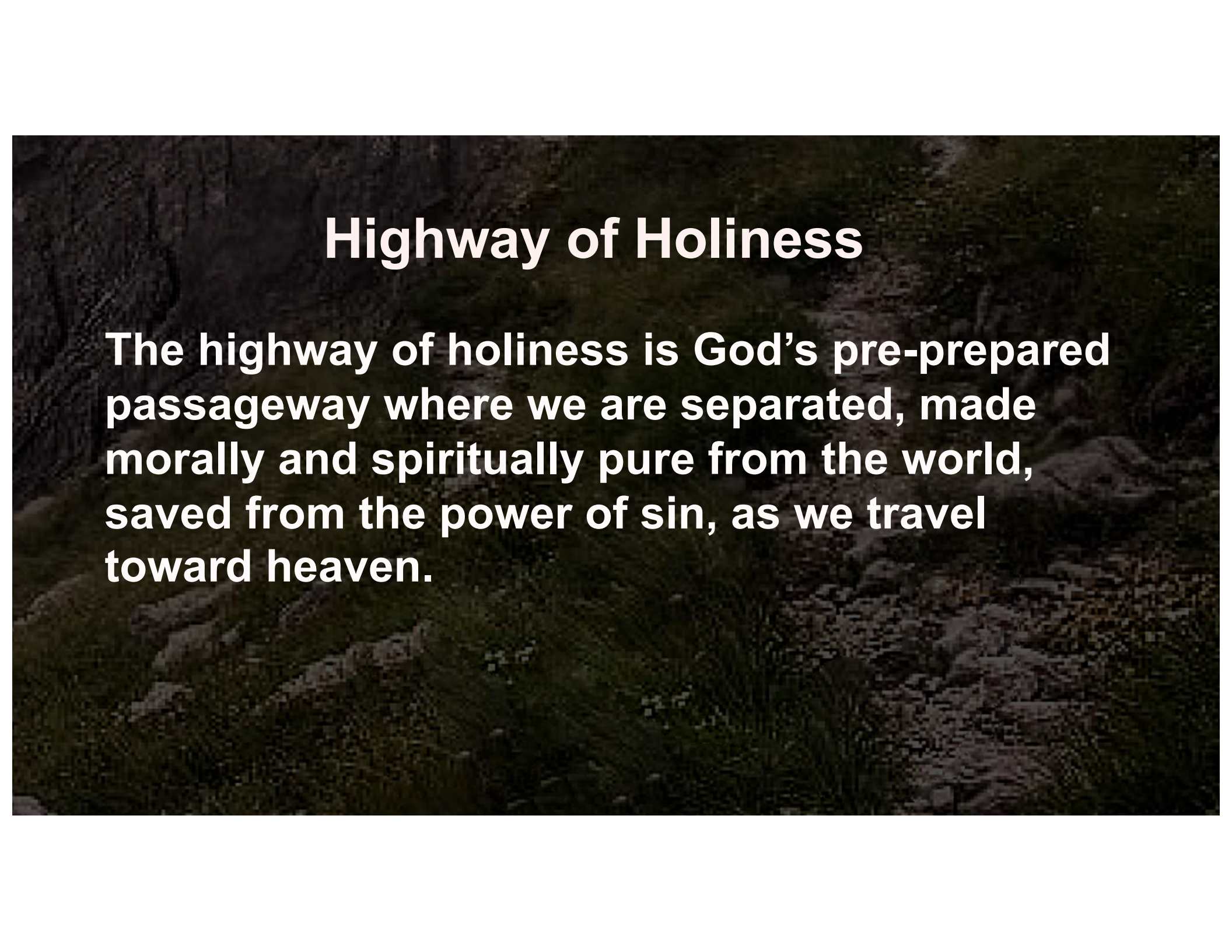

Authority

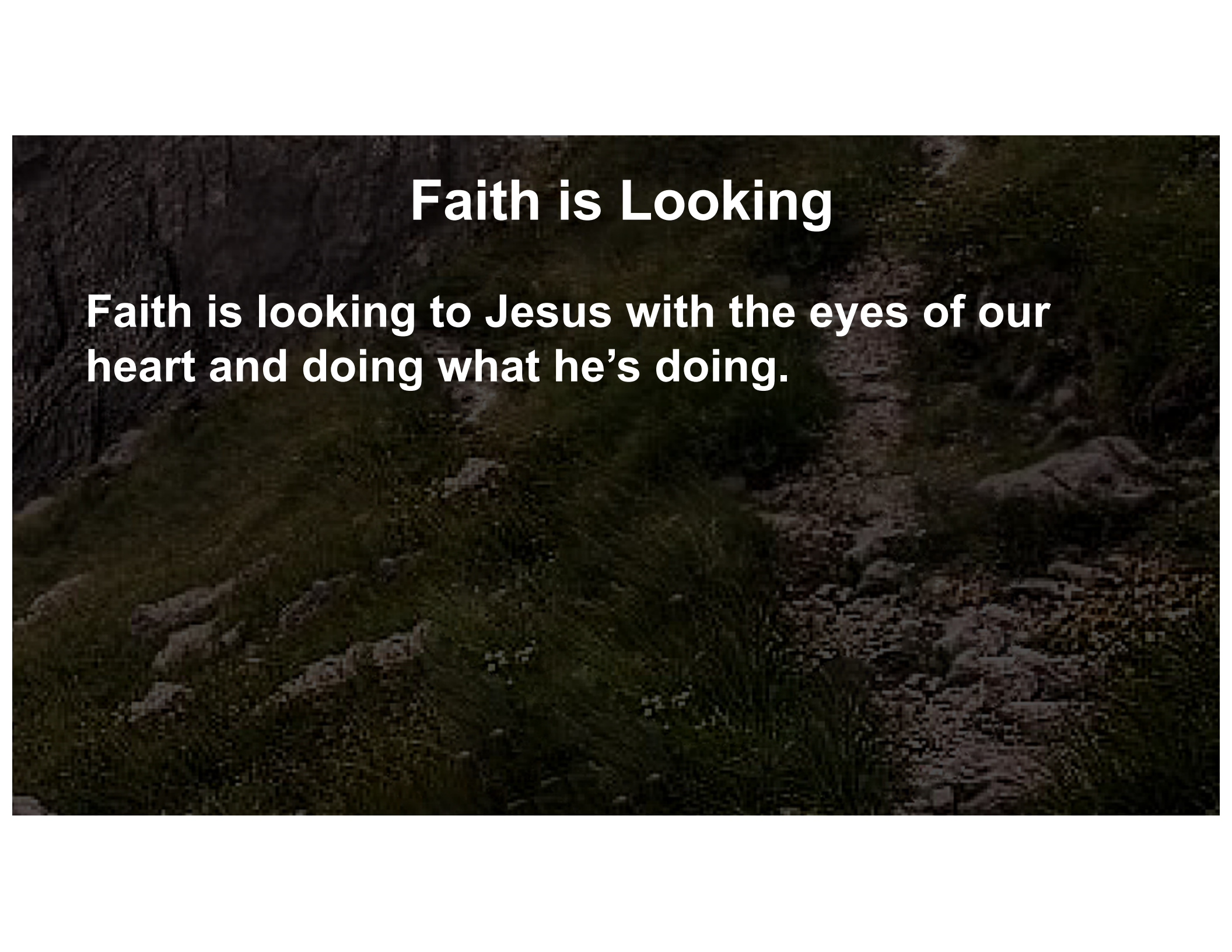
Authority (Greek exousia) means ability to choose, the right to govern.

Power (Greek dynamis, dunamis,) means the ability or strength to act.

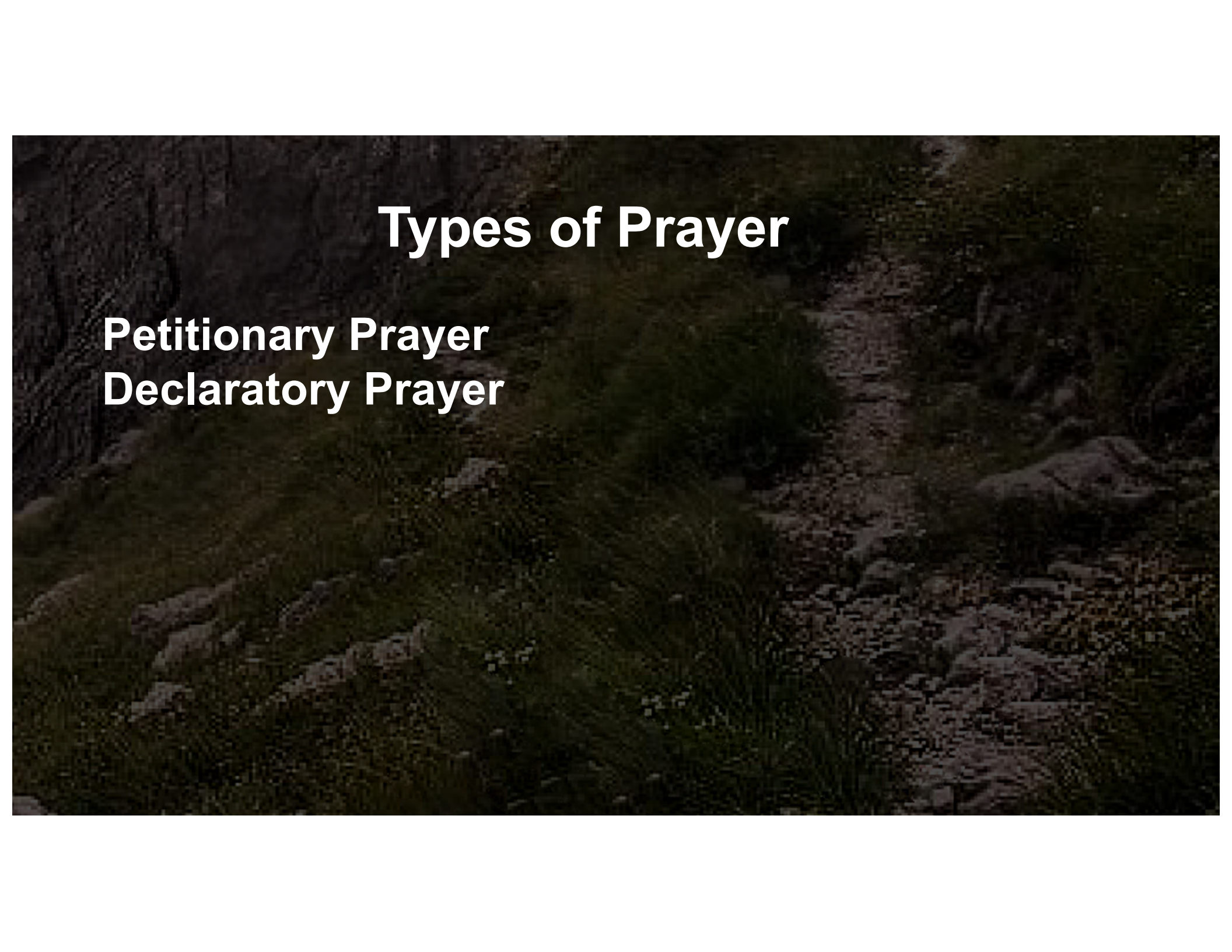
Everyone has Faith

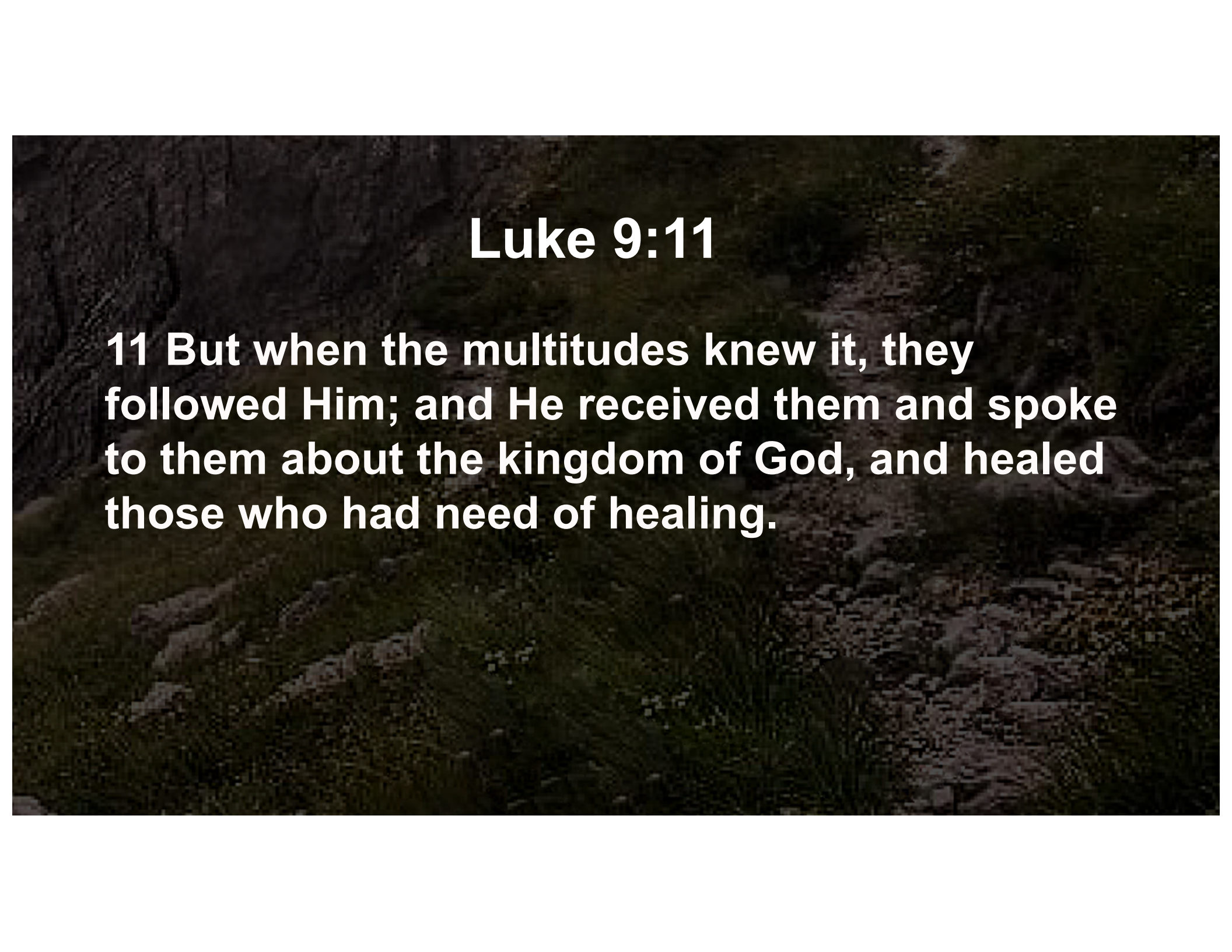
Physical Needs

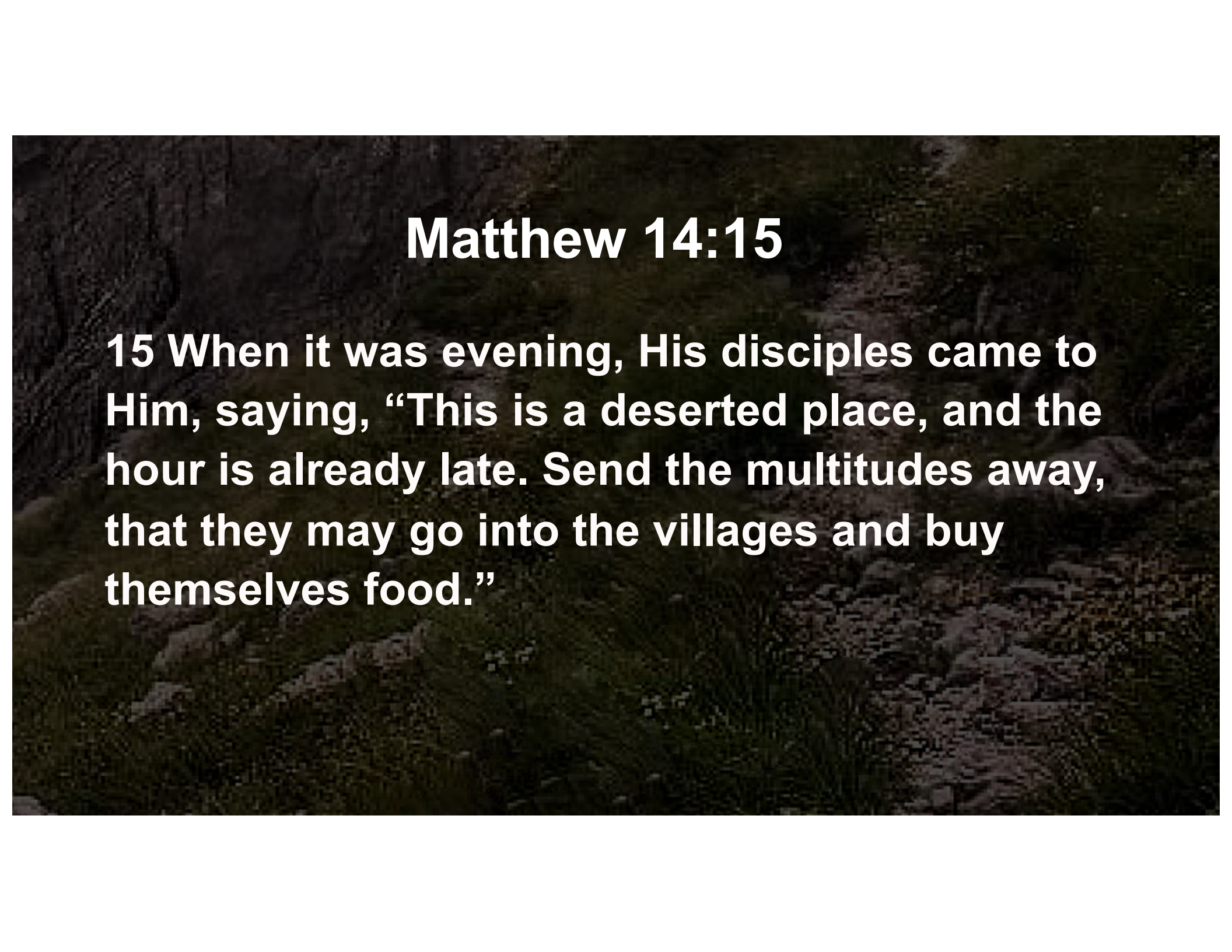
John 6:1-14

2. How can we buy bread? **Affordability**



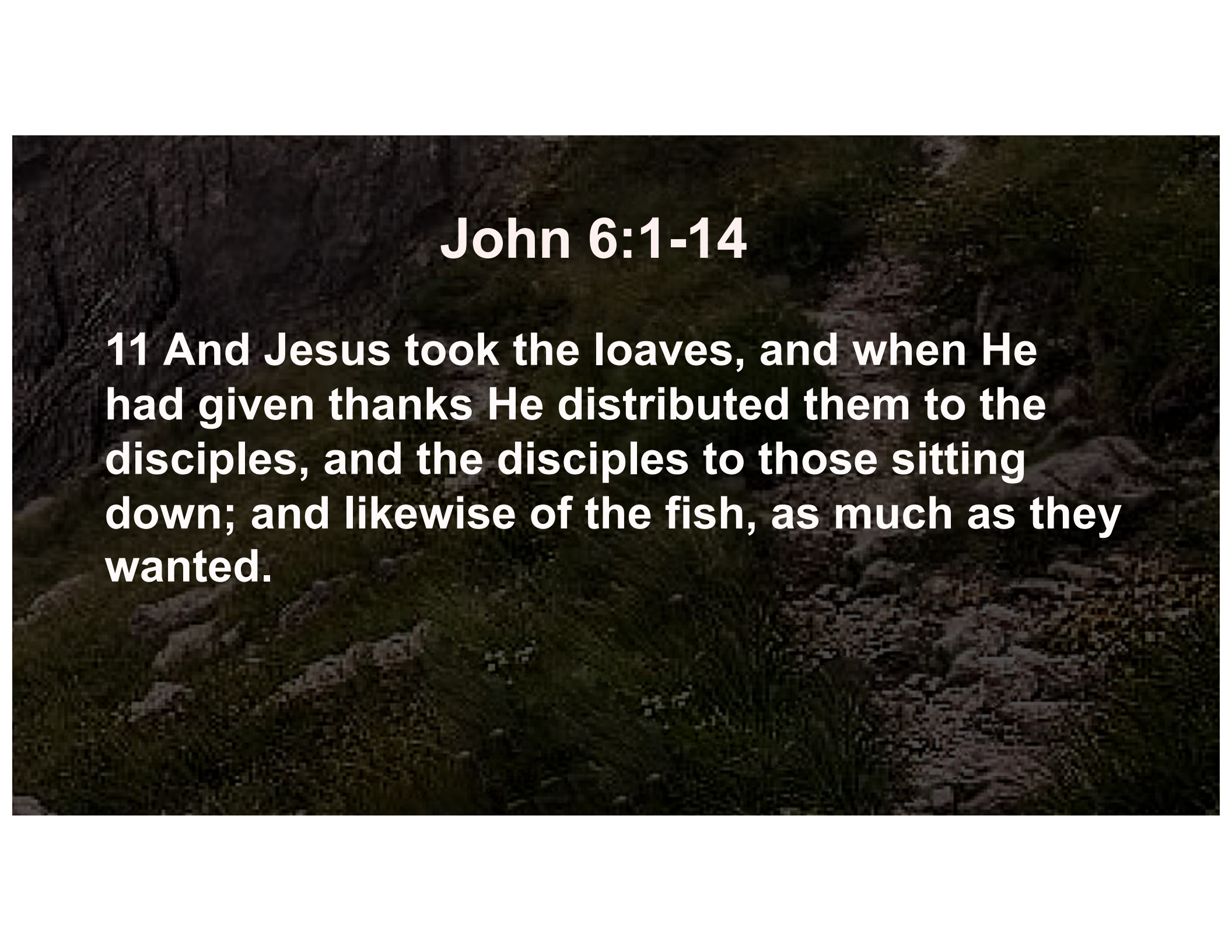

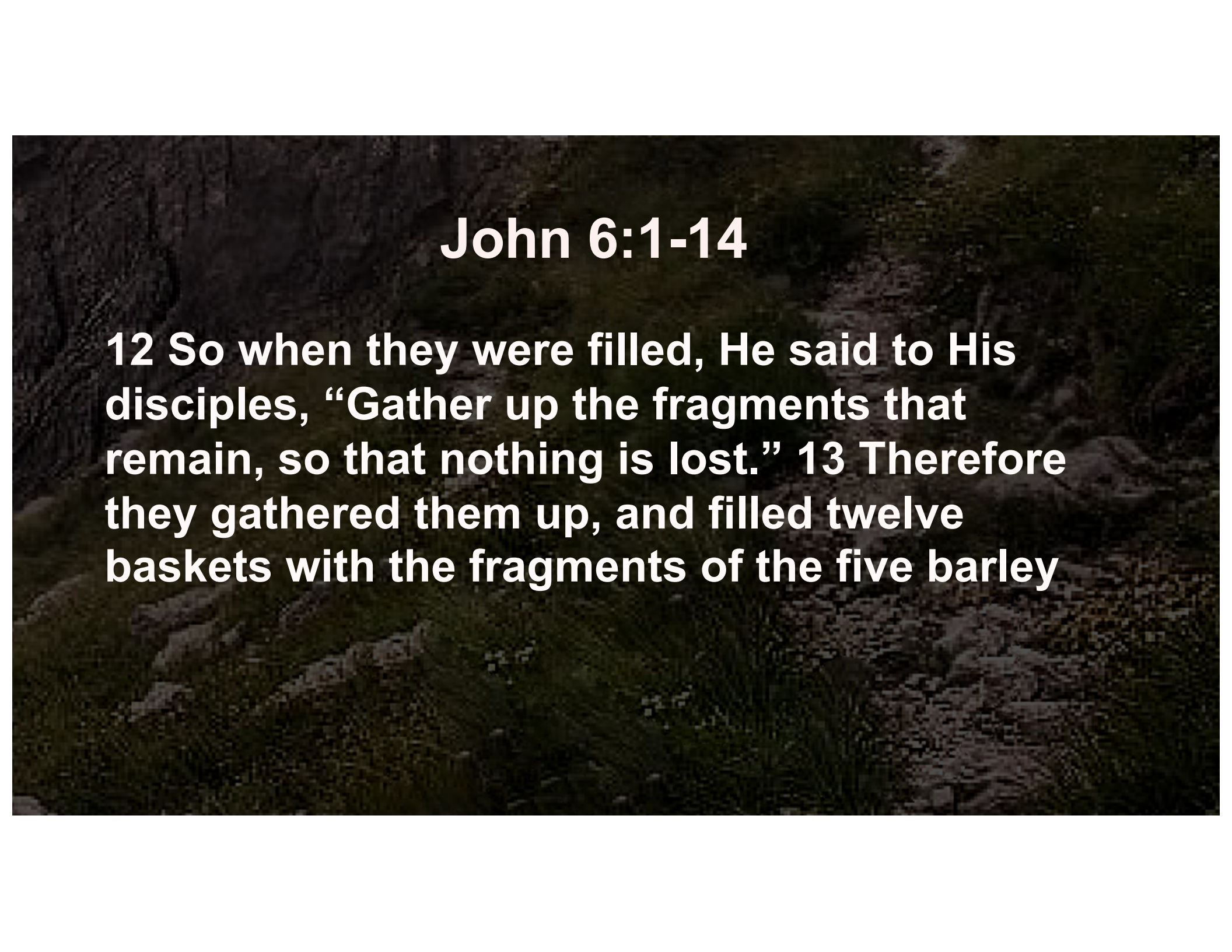

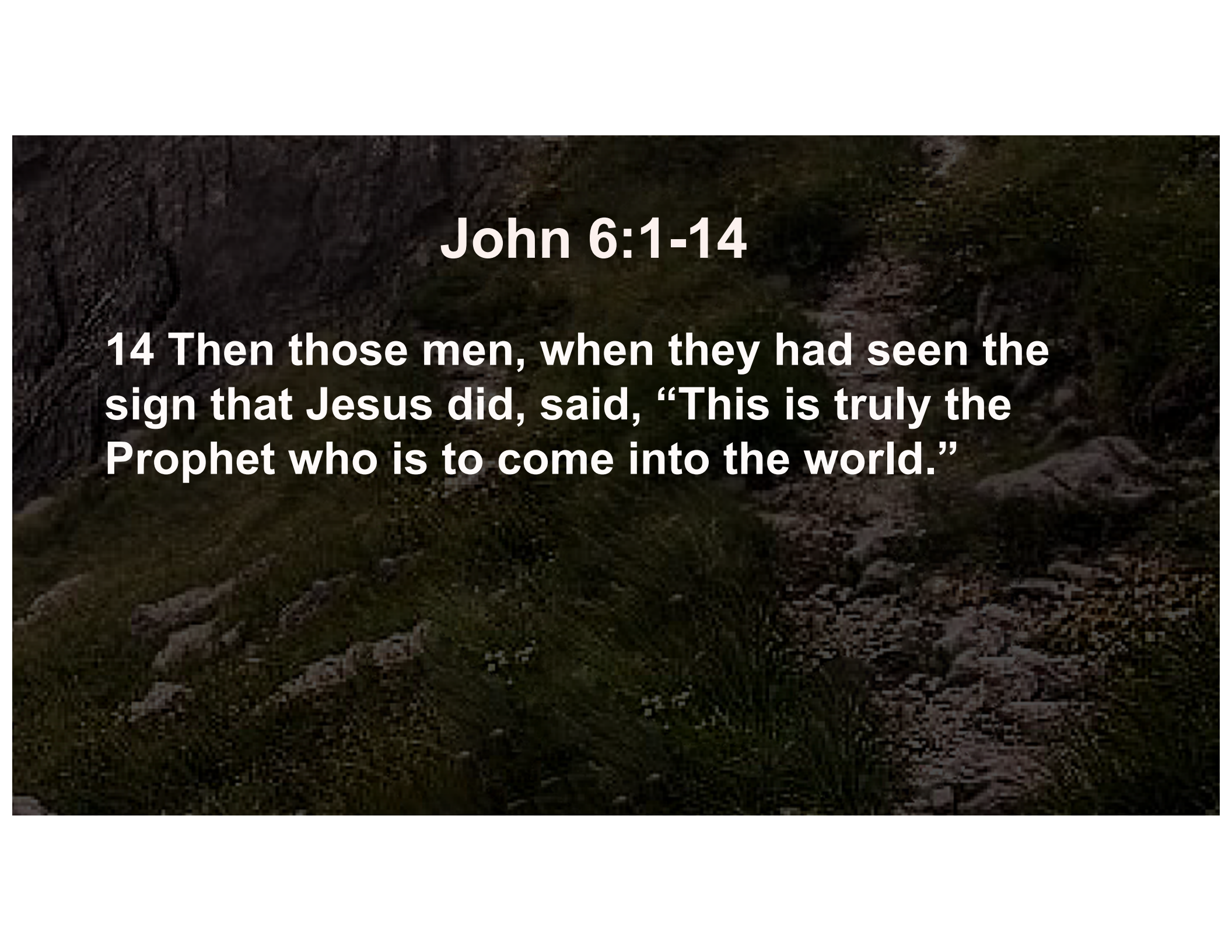
John 6:1-14

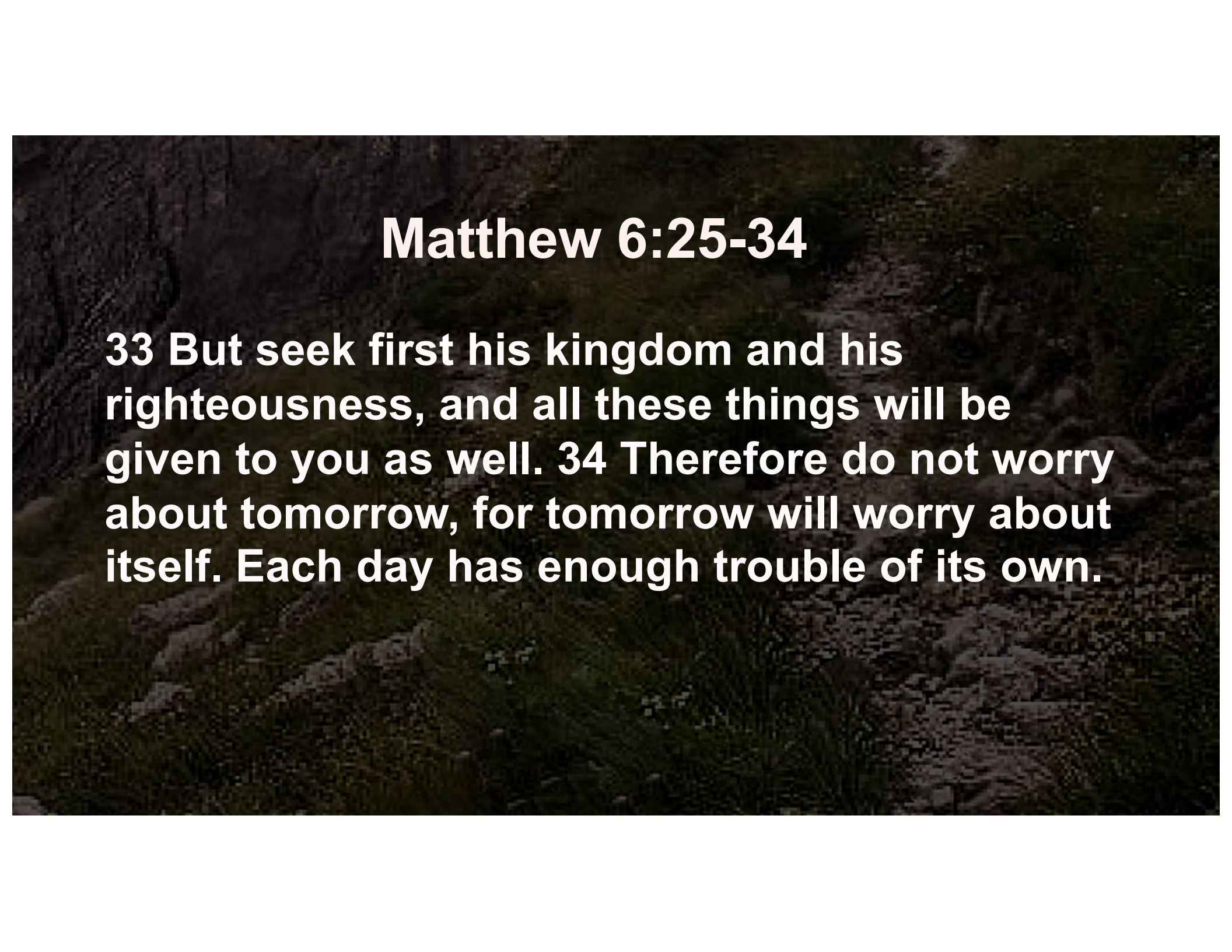

Relational	Loss, Loneliness, Rejection

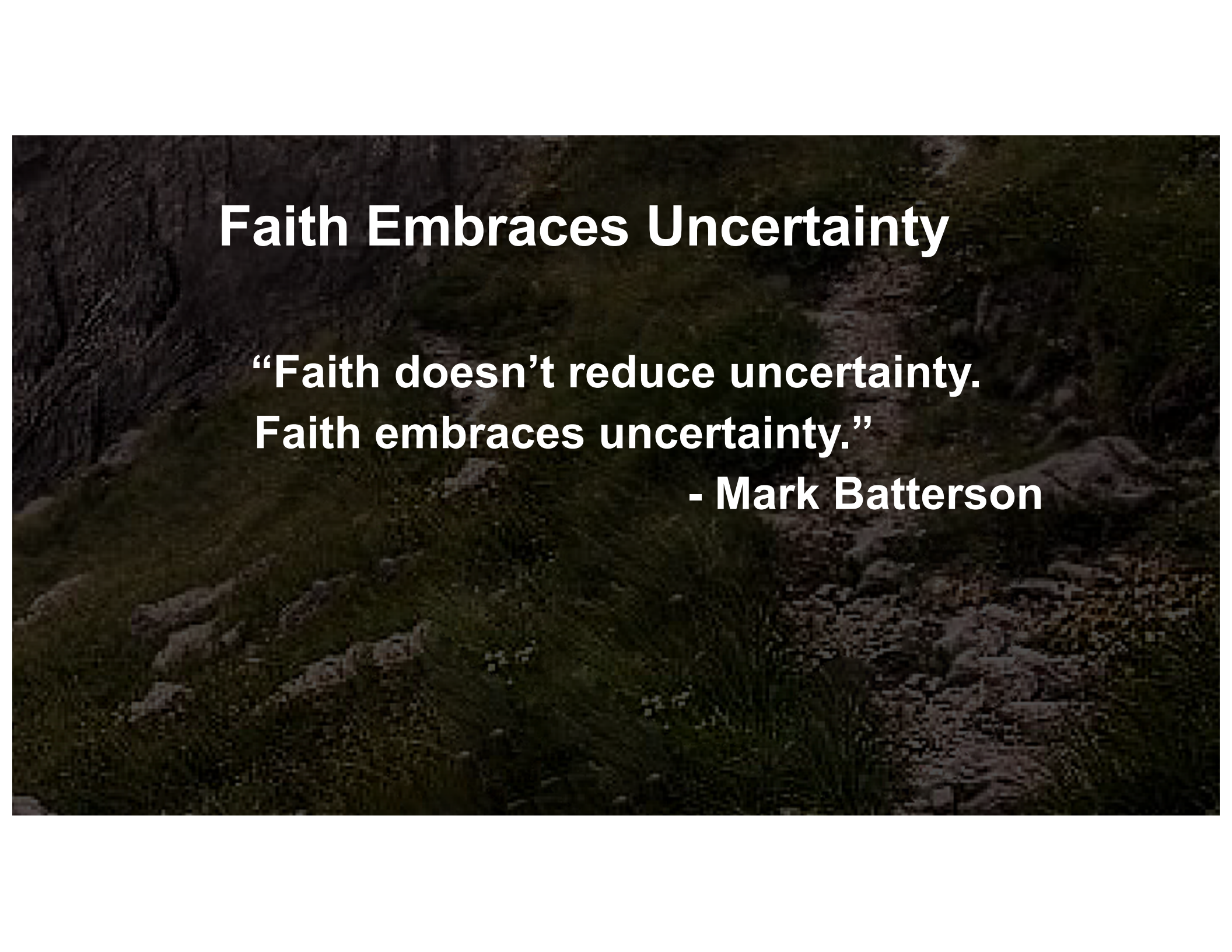
Anxiety

Anxiety - Greek word merimnáō (from the root Greek word mérimna, "a part, as opposed to the whole" – properly, drawn in opposite directions; "divided into parts" or "to go to pieces" because pulled apart (in different directions),

Fear is an immediate threat, Anxiety long term.

Where to Look with eyes of our heart

The eyes of our heart [faith] are looking at something or someone to meet a legitimate need. The heart has led the mind to pursue thoughts, ideas, and desires in the direction it is looking. The mind has a habit of thinking this way and changing means a change in the eyes

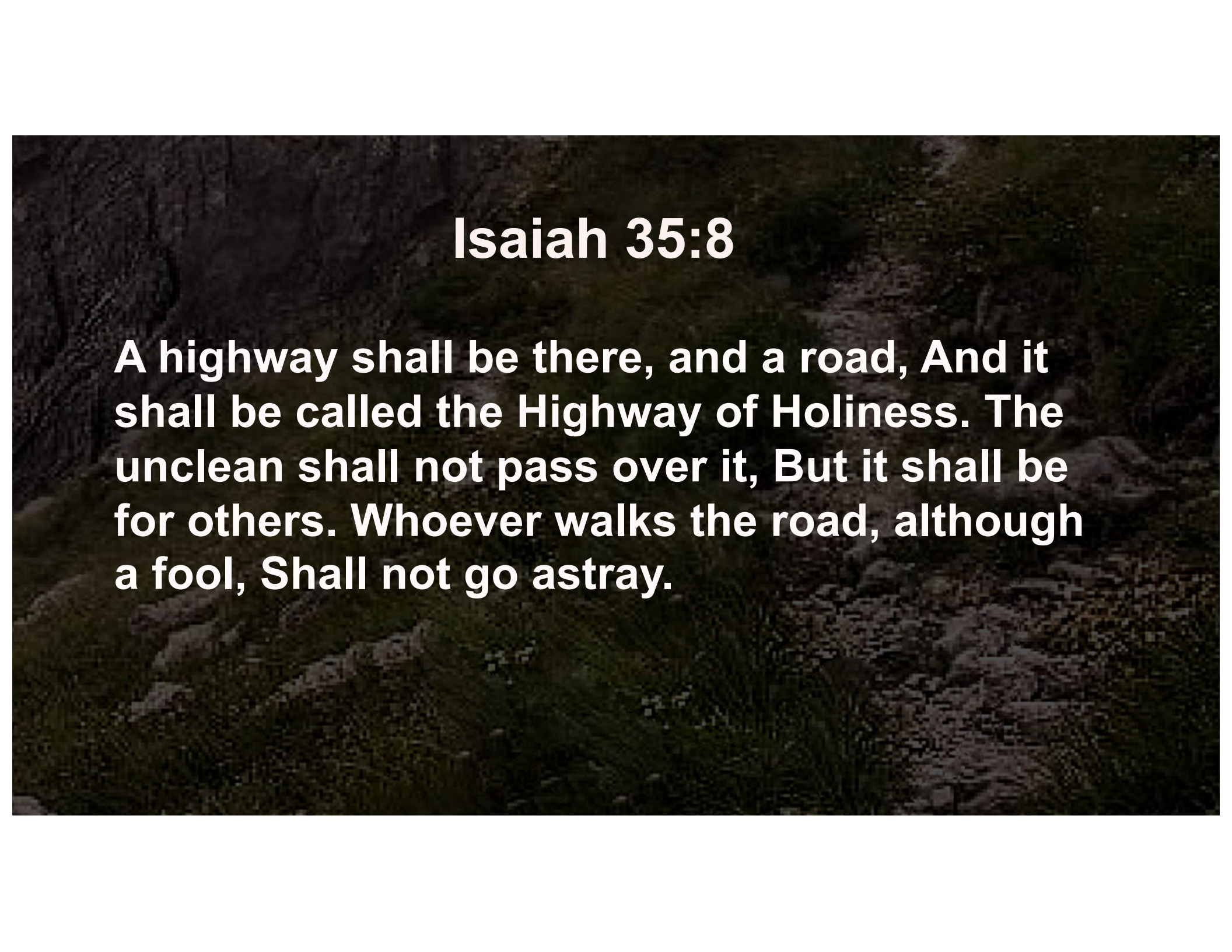
Where to Look with eyes of our heart

It is helpful to reflect in each circumstance where we are looking with the eyes of our heart. Our emotions are a clue (although not definitive) as to where the eyes of our heart are looking. If the eyes of our heart are looking to ourselves and our resources (money, property, effort, relationships) then anxiety and fear of their loss or failure will be our lot.

Isaiah 26:3

"You will keep him in perfect peace, Whose mind is stayed [steadfast] on You, Because he trusts in You."

The causal relationship is clear: heart trusts, is looking to the Lord, then the mind naturally is fixed upon and rests in Him – the peace of God
