Tēhillah

Hebrew 8416 = a **hymn of halal**, A hymn of spontaneous praise glorifying God in song. The word English Psalm is translated from the Hebrew word Tehillah

Halal

Hebrew Halal 1984 – clamorously foolish, boast about the Lord, Rave about the Lord

The verb הלל (halal) means to shine (what excited stars do) or praise and cheer (what excited souls do)

Style: Halal - clamorously foolish

And David offered burnt offerings and peace offerings before the Lord. And when David had finished offering the burnt offerings and the peace offerings, he blessed the people in the name of the Lord of hosts and distributed among all the people, the whole multitude of Israel, both men and women,

... and I will celebrate before the Lord. I will make myself yet more contemptible than this, and I will be abased in your eyes. But by the female servants of whom you have spoken, by them I shall be held in honor." And Michal the daughter of Saul had no child to the day of her death.

Obed-Edom

"Obed" = "the servant who honors God in the right way"; "Edom" (lit. "red")= "one who causes to blush." He made David blush for shame because David was at first afraid to receive the Ark, whereas Obed-edom took it into his house without hesitation.

Jeduthun

Personal name meaning, "praise." Prophetic musician and Levite in the service of King David (1 Chronicles 25:1). The names **Asaph** and **Heman** appear along with that of **Jeduthun** as original ancestors of Temple musicians. In 1Chronicles 25:1,3 he is said to have prophesied using musical instruments; and in 2 Chronicles 35:15 he is referred to as

Jeduthun

And in 2 Chronicles 35:15 he is referred to as the king's seer. Psalms (39; 62; 77) include his name in their titles. "To the Chief Musician. To Jeduthun. A Psalm of David.

House of Praise

God caused the Ark of His Presence to find rest in a house of praise. Praise (and grumbling) are learned behaviors that are often passed down to our children. Praise prospers any house. Make a decision to have a house of praise.

Michal

A princess of the United Kingdom of Israel; the younger daughter of King Saul, she was the first wife of David (1 Samuel 18:20–27), who later became king, first of Judah, then of Israel.

It is interesting to note the difference between influence of Obed-edom's passion for God's presence that caused David try again after failure and the influence of Michal who was worried about what everyone else was thinking about her husband David's behavior.
