The very day that Jesus rode into Jerusalem on the colt of a donkey was the day that Jewish people called "Lamb Selection Day" – 10th day of the month of Nisan - when the lambs that were going to be sacrificed in the Temple for Passover were brought into the city.

- 4. Kept until the 14th day of Nisan when all the Passover lambs were sacrificed

The Jewish people traveled up to Jerusalem (2700 ft. above sea level) for three feasts (Passover, Pentecost, Tabernacles). They made the ascent together and chanted from Psalms 120 to 134 which is why they are called the Psalms of Ascents.


