LIFE GROUP QUESTIONS:

Icebreaker: Have you ever traveled to a place where you didn't speak the native language? What linguistic challenges did you face?

Have everyone spend time reading **Acts 2:1-13** quietly to themselves. After a few minutes, either have one person read the passage for the group or have each person take turns reading a portion until the entire passage has been read.

Sermon Observation Questions

1. Was there anything from this past week's sermon that stood out to you? Explain. Was there anything from the sermon that confused you? Explain. Was there anything from the sermon that invoked an emotion? If so, what was it?
2. Observations about this passage: Who was the audience or the characters? What does this passage tell us about sinful man? What do we learn about God or Jesus from reading this passage, and how does that impact the way we love people and love God?
3. What questions arise from reading this passage? Is there anything from this passage that sticks out to you personally? If so, what?

Life Application Questions

1. What do you think it would have been like to experience what happened to the disciples on Pentecost?
2. What is the purpose of God's Spirit in our lives (take some time to find Bible passages that support your claims)?
3. The Spirit enables ordinary people, like the Galileans, to do extraordinary things for the Kingdom of God. Looking at your own life, what extraordinary thing has God done through you by the power of the Holy Spirit to advance His Kingdom?
4. **Next Steps:** What steps can you take to be led more by the Spirit and less by yourself?
