#### **SPEAKING LIGHT**

#### **OVERVIEW:**

For a period of around four hundred years, Israel found itself in a season of spiritual silence and darkness, but at God's perfectly chosen time, a baby came into the world that would shed light into the darkness. #### **DISCUSSION GUIDE**

- How did Sunday's teaching impact you personally?

- How might the message from this past week impact your circles of influence (e.g., home, work, community, church?)
- How could living out the teaching from Sunday differ from how you've currently lived?
- What might you need to rearrange in your life to apply the sermon?

- What questions do you have concerning the teaching?
- How might this Old Testament passage reveal Jesus Christ or a need for Christ?
- How could what you learned on Sunday help you disciple someone else?

#### Scripture Reading Questions (see other side for scriptures)

- What comfort do you find in God, as He is described in the Psalms 40 and 85 passages?
- In light of the Apostle Peter's remarks in 2 Peter, how are we to live as Christians? Does your life currently compare to the characteristics of the faithful found in this passage?
- Like John the Baptist, how can we prepare the way for the Lord's return for those in our circles of influence?
