**Eph 6:11-20** Keyword: [Stand]

11 Put on the whole armor of God, that you **[may be able]** to **stand against the wiles of the devil**. 12 For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against **principalities**, against

**powers**, against the **rulers** of the darkness of this age, against **spiritual hosts of wickedness** in the heavenly places. 13 Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to **withstand in the evil day**, and having done all, to stand.

14 Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth, having put on the breastplate of righteousness, 15 and having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace; 16 above all, taking the shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one. 17 And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God; 18 praying always with all prayer and supplication in the Spirit, being watchful to this end with all perseverance and supplication for all the saints — 19 and for me, that utterance may be given to me, that I may

open my mouth boldly to make known the mystery of the gospel,

## **Dan 10**

### **Vision of the Glorious Man**

10 In the third year of Cyrus king of Persia a message was revealed to Daniel, whose name was called Belteshazzar. The message was true, but the appointed time was long; and he understood the message and had understanding of the vision. 2 In those days I, Daniel, was mourning three full weeks. 3 I ate no pleasant food, no meat or wine came into my mouth, nor did I anoint myself at all, till three whole weeks were fulfilled.

4 Now on the twenty-fourth day of the first month, as I was by the side of the great river, that is, the Tigris, 5 I lifted my eyes and looked,

and behold, a certain man clothed in linen,  
whose waist was girded with gold of Uphaz! 6  
His body was like beryl, his face like the  
appearance of lightning, his eyes like torches of  
fire, his arms and feet like burnished bronze in  
color, and the sound of his words like the voice  
of a multitude.

7 And I, Daniel, alone saw the vision, for the  
men who were with me did not see the vision;  
but a great terror fell upon them, so that they  
fled to hide themselves. 8 Therefore I was left  
alone when I saw this great vision, and no  
strength remained in me; for my vigor was  
turned to frailty in me, and I retained no  
strength. 9 Yet I heard the sound of his words;  
and while I heard the sound of his words I was  
in a deep sleep on my face, with my face to the  
ground.

Prophecies Concerning Persia and Greece

10 Suddenly, a hand touched me, which made me tremble on my knees and on the palms of my hands. 11 And he said to me, "O Daniel, man greatly beloved, understand the words that I speak to you, and stand upright, for I have now been sent to you." While he was speaking this word to me, I stood trembling.

12 Then he said to me, "Do not fear, Daniel, for from the first day that you set your heart to understand, and to humble yourself before your God, your words were heard; and I have come because of your words. 13 But the prince of the kingdom of Persia withstood me twenty-one days; and behold, Michael, one of the chief princes, came to help me, for I had been left alone there with the kings of Persia. 14 Now I have come to make you understand what will happen to your people in the latter days, for the vision refers to many days yet to come."

15 When he had spoken such words to me, I turned my face toward the ground and became speechless. 16 And suddenly, one having the likeness of the sons of men touched my lips; then I opened my mouth and spoke, saying to him who stood before me, "My lord, because of the vision my sorrows have overwhelmed me, and I have retained no strength. 17 For how can this servant of my lord talk with you, my lord? As for me, no strength remains in me now, nor is any breath left in me."

18 Then again, the one having the likeness of a man touched me and strengthened me. 19 And he said, "O man greatly beloved, fear not! Peace be to you; be strong, yes, be strong!"

So when he spoke to me I was strengthened, and said, "Let my lord speak, for you have strengthened me."

20 Then he said, "Do you know why I have come to you? And now I must return to fight

with the prince of Persia; and when I have gone forth, indeed the prince of Greece will come. 21 But I will tell you what is noted in the Scripture of Truth. (No one upholds me against these, except Michael your prince.

Who is Satan:

1. He is the deceiver of all men (Revelation 12:9; 20:1 – 10; 2 Corinthians 11:14).
2. Yet the power of death until Christ conquered death, hell, and the grave (Hebrews 2:14; one Corinthians 15:24 – 28; Revelation 1:18; 20:11 – 15).
3. He is the leader of all sinners and backsliders in the human race (1 John 3:8 – 10; one Timothy 5:15) and of all spirit rebels (Ephesians 6:10 – 18; Matthew 9:34).
4. He causes sickness and disease and physical and mental maladies in the human race (Luke 13:16; John 10:10; acts 10:38).

5. He takes advantage of all adversities of men to further their rebellion and hold them captive (2 Corinthians 2:11; 1 Timothy 1:20; 5:11 – 15; 1 Peter 5:8 – 9).
6. He attempts and provokes men to sin (1 Chronicles 21:1; Mark 1:13; one Corinthians 7:5).
7. He causes of fence and opposition to God (Matthew 16:23).
8. He transformed himself into an angel of light to deceive (2 Corinthians 11:14).
9. He resist others who would serve God (Zechariah 3:1 – 2; 1 Peter 5:8 – 9).
10. He enters into union with others against God (Luke 22:3; John 13:2).
11. He sends messengers to defeat saints (2 Corinthians 12:1 – 7; Daniel 10:12 – 21).
12. He hinders the gospel (1 Thessalonians 2:18; acts 13:10).

13. He steals the word of God from the hearts of the people lest they should believe it and be saved (Matthew 13:19; Luke 8:12).
14. Hindus men with power to work miracles (2 Thessalonians 2:9; Revelation 13:1 – 18).
15. He wars on messengers of God and sometimes holds them captive (Daniel 10:12 – 21).
16. He said snares for man to fall into sin (1 Timothy 3:7; 2 Timothy 2:26).
17. He makes war on the Saints (Ephesians 6:10 – 18; 1 Peter 5:8 – 9).
18. He causes divergence and blinds men to the gospel (2 Corinthians 4:4).
19. He causes double mindedness (James 1:5 – 9); doubt and unbelief (Romans 14:23; Genesis 3:4 – 5); darkness and oppression (2 Corinthians 4:4; 2 Peter 1:4 – 9); deadness and weakness (Hebrews 6:1; 9:14); delay and compromise (acts 24:25;

26:28); and division and strife among men (1 Peter 5:8; one Corinthians 3:1 – 3).

20. He stirs up the passions and lust of men and gains control of them as they submit to his demon forces (John 8:44; Ephesians 2:1 – 3; 1 John 2:15 – 17).
