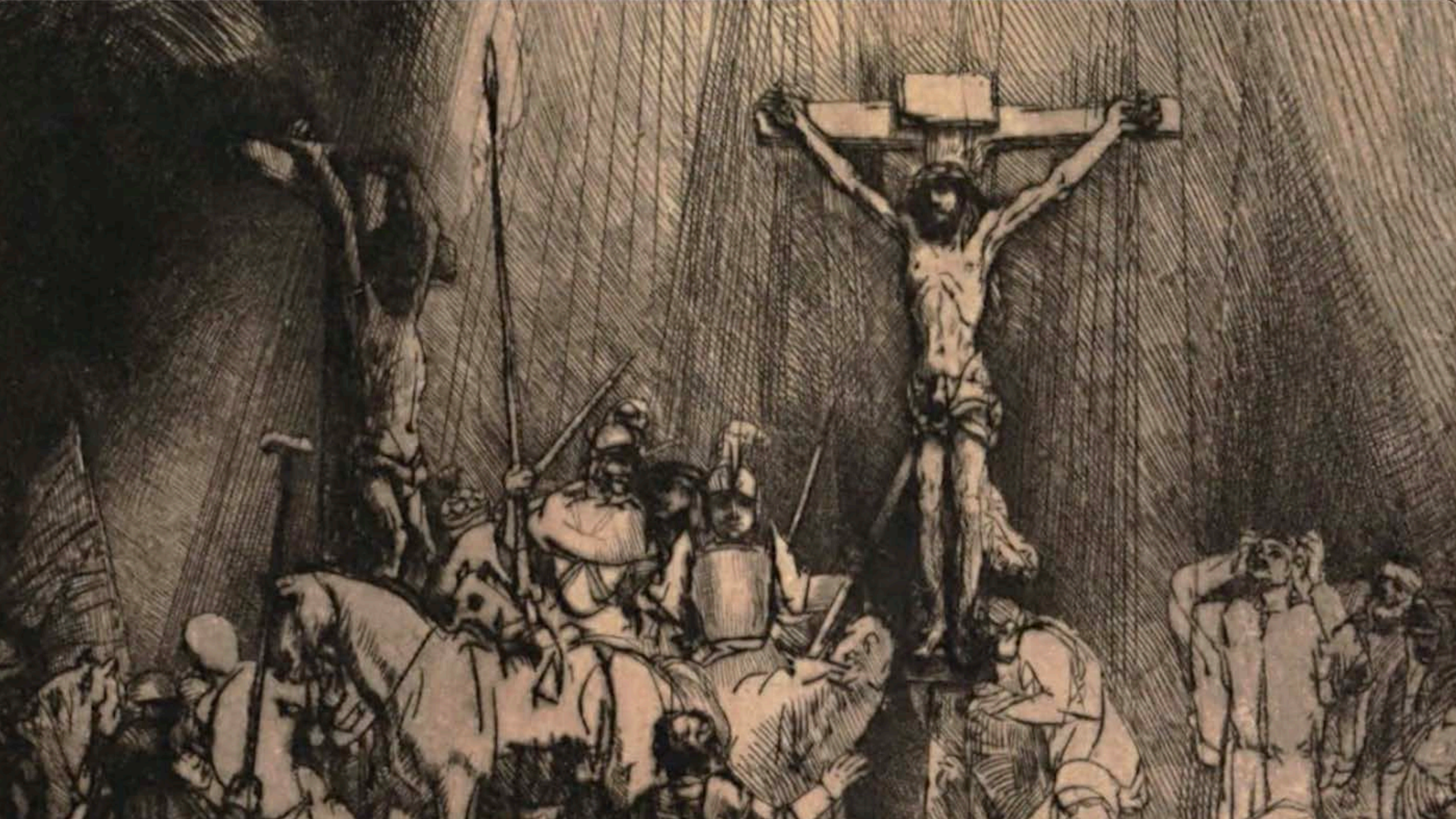


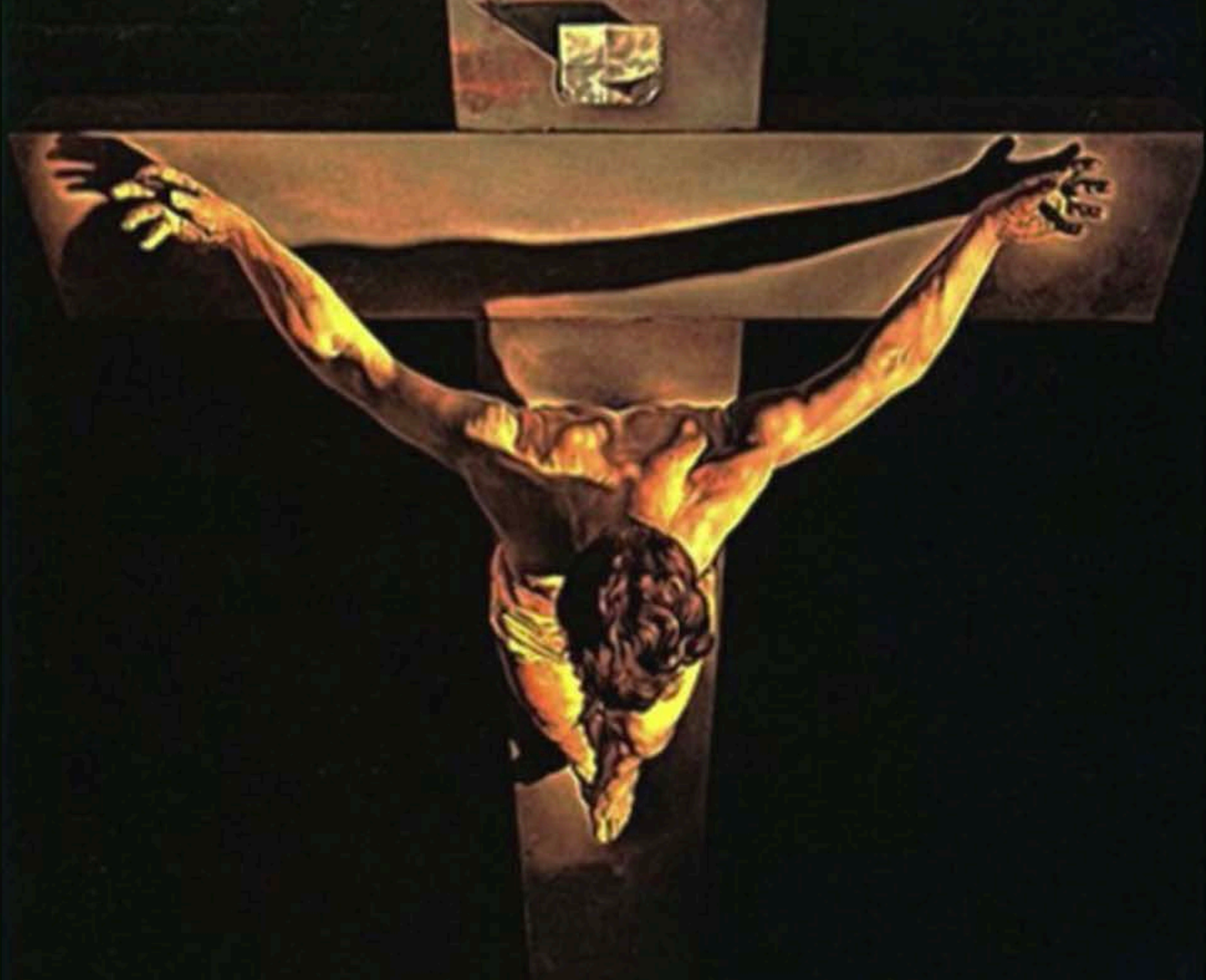














Three times in Mark's

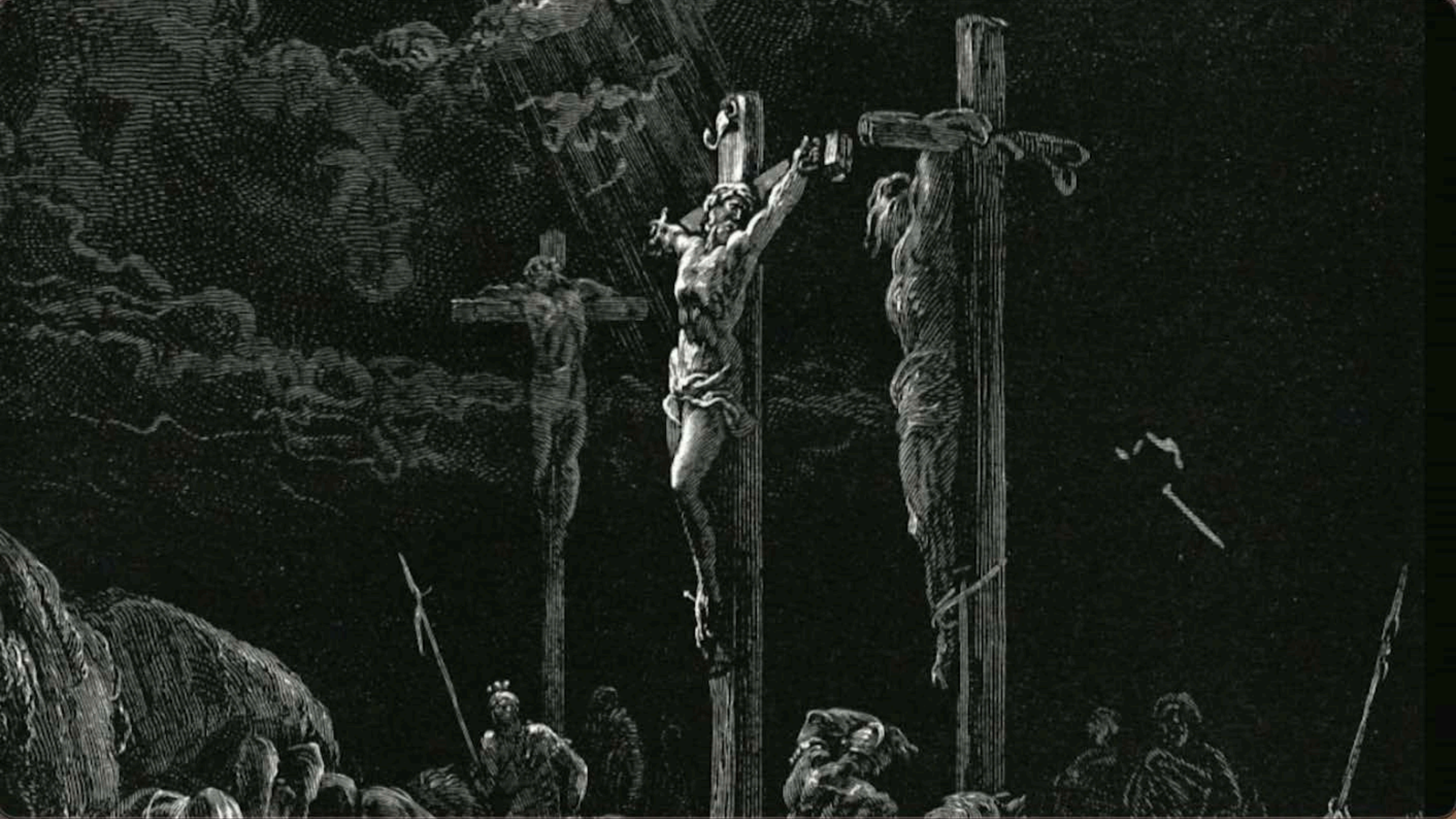
