(Luke 24:13-35)

INTRODUCTION

Our Bible studies throughout 2022 focus on JESUS Through the Eyes of Luke, from Luke’s Gospel and his Book of Acts. Every Sunday we study and apply God’s Word. In Luke 24, as of Friday, the crucified Christ was dead and buried. Then, on Easter Sunday, the Risen Christ encountered two of His heartbroken disciples leaving Jerusalem for their hometown, Emmaus, a 7-mile walk. Today’s Bible study reveals these two disciples had:

A. Blinded eyes (24:15-18, 31)

B. Blasted hopes (24:19b-24)

C. Burning hearts (24:28-35)

These disciples are living proof on this Easter Sunday that:

I. The Risen Lord is with us as we walk life’s road (24:13-16)

II. The Risen Lord is with us as we search the Scriptures

(24:27, 32)

III. The Risen Lord is with us as we break bread together

(24:30-31)

CONCLUSION

The Risen Jesus changed their sadness to joy on that first Easter Sunday. He can do the same for you if you:

A. Open your Bible (24:27) C. Open your eyes (24:31)

B. Open your home (24:29) D. Open your lips (24:35)

-Applying Today's Sermon to Your Life -

Is it possible that we sometimes don't recognize Him walking with us, also?

3. Why did Jesus begin with Moses and the prophets in explaining what happened?

What lessons should we learn from Jesus' example?

4. What opened the eyes of the two men?

A. Burst of insight?

B. They saw His scars when they broke bread?

C. The Holy Spirit?

D. Putting two and two together?

5. Would Jesus have stayed with the men if they had not urged Him to stay? Why

did the men want to return to Jerusalem after they'd just walked seven miles?

6. Ken surfaced three ways the Risen Lord is with us. Which of these three ways is

most meaningful to you in this season in your life, and why?

7. Imagine living today without faith, without knowing Jesus, without knowing how

to pray, and without a supportive church family. Now think about your neighbors,

your coworkers, your relatives, your classmates, your friends, and people in your

circle of acquaintance. Who needs your faith, your Jesus, your prayers, your

church family? Will you ask Jesus to make His appeal to them through you?
