#### Introduction

Every Sunday of 2022, our Bible studies focus on JESUS Through the Eyes of Luke, from Luke's Gospel and his Book of Acts. Every Sunday we study and apply God's Word. This week we'll turn to Luke chapter 4, verses 14-21 as Luke tells the story of a time when Jesus shared a sermon in the town he grew up in. Study God's Word - Luke 4:14-21

- 2. Jesus' Job Description:
  - A. <u>Preach</u> the <u>Good News</u> (4:18)
  - B. Freedom for prisoners (4:18)
  - C. Recovery for the blind (4:18)
  - D. <u>Release</u> for the <u>oppressed</u> (4:18)
  - E. <u>Proclaim</u> the <u>Year</u> of <u>Jubilee</u> (4:19)
- 3. Jesus' Announcement: I am the Messiah (4:21)

## Apply God's Word

- 1. <u>Realize true</u> freedom comes through <u>Jesus</u> <u>alone</u>.
- 2. Ask, Do you have freedom?

3. Ask, if you do, how will you use your freedom?
