(Revelation 2:8-11)

INTRODUCTION

Our 2023 Bible studies are from "Short New Testament Letters." Every Sunday we study and apply God's Word. Revelation 2-3 contain letters from Jesus to seven first century churches. Study His timeless encouragement, instruction and warnings. The church at Smyrna was 'Faithful No Matter What':

I. Approval (Revelation 2:8-11) A. Christ's credentials (2:8-9a) 1. He is the First & the Last 2. He died & came back to life 3. He knows B. Church's condition (v. 9) 1. Application (Revelation 2:8-11) C. Commit your burden to the Lord with the support of others (Mt. 10:29-31) A. Ask for help in prayer together (Phil. 4:6-8) S. Search the Scriptures with your church (2 Tim. 3:16; Ps. 119:28; Lk. 4:16) T. Trust Him individually and together, for He does care for you! (Mt. 9:36; 14:14)

CONCLUSION

The local church is God's plan for changing the world, one life at a time! Jesus' seven letters to the churches of Revelation 2-3 prove that a healthy local church is the hope of the world! Christ loved the

Church, and gave Himself up for Her (Eph. 5:25)! His plan is to reach and redeem the world with the message of the Cross through the local church! May His messages to the seven churches inspire each one of us, our entire congregation, to be 'Faithful No Matter What'!

Applying Today's Sermon to Your Life

The condition of the church in Smyrna was terrible but Christ had the power and
